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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU)
BETWEEN CSIR-INSTITUTE OF HIMALAYAN BIORESOURCE
TECHNOLOGY, PALAMPUR AND CENTRAL UNIVERSITY of HIMACHAL
PRADESH, DHARAMSALA

#### Preamble:

1.

1.1 Whereas the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and the University Grants Commission (UGC) have realized the need for a close linkage between National Laboratories and Universities in terms of research and academic activities. In compliance to this idea, the Institute of Himalayan Bioresource Technology (IHBT), Palampur and the Central University of Himachal Pradesh (CUHP), established under the Central Universities Act,

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2009, have expressed a desire to join hands for the cause of promotion of quality research and high end science and decided to sign Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to initiate academic and research programmes between the two Institutions in the broad areas of Biosciences and Bioinformatics as per the following terms and conditions:

#### 2. Recitals

- 2.1 AND WHEREAS both the CSIR-IHBT and the CUHP recognize that they share common goals and are desirous to establish, a cooperative arrangement towards - strengthening Indian higher education and research through mutual resource sharing.
- 2.2 AND WHEREAS both organizations are desirous to associate in all other related areas as may be agreed upon for furtherance of knowledge based enterprises, apt technical and management skill for future technology development, exchanging of information and work towards effective Research Institutions-Academia partnerships for Human Resource Development and R&D.
- 2.3 NOW THE PARTIES (CSIR-IHBT and CUHP) HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGE AND agree to collaborate on collaborative and joint research work in the various areas of mutual interest by entering into this MoU covering the activities as detailed below:

### 3. Period of MoU and its Extension

- 3.1 This MoU comes into effect from the date of its signing and will remain in force till the completion of five (05) years. Its validity can be extended by mutual agreement between both the parties.
- 3.2 This MoU supersedes all the previous correspondences and discussions, undertakings and agreement between the two parties on the subject pertaining to this MoU.

#### 4. Scope of MoU

- 4.1 The scope of the MoU will be to collaborate for research and teaching in the designated subjects of Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Chemistry, and Molecular Biology or any other branch of Life Sciences or Chemical Sciences. Both the Parties hereto wish to record the following main areas of cooperation on mutually agreed terms and conditions.
  - 4.1.1 Mutually sharing of infrastructural facility for persuing research and conducting R&D programmes.
  - 4.1.2 Knowledge sharing in the field of Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Chemistry, and Molecular Biology or any other branch of Life Sciences or Chemical Sciences.
  - 4.1.3 Exchange of faculty in regular courses and training programme from both the institutions. For the mutual benefit of the two Institutions, there will be exchange of CSIR-IHBT scientists and faculty members of the concerned school of CUHP.
  - 4.1.4 Collaborative and Joint research projects by the CSIR-IHBT scientists and faculty members of the concerned schools of CUHP through mutual sharing of the research facilities at CSIR-IHBT and CUHP.
  - 4.1.5 CSIR-IHBT and CUHP will work closely to generate appropriately trained manpower in the mutually identified areas of Science & Technology through organization of formal academic curricula, symposia, short-term training courses, etc. TA/DA for scientists and research scholars will be borne by the respective organizations.

#### 4.2 Responsibility of CUHP

4.2.1 CUHP will recognize CSIR-IHST as an accredited Centre for supervising and guiding and pursuing research, leading to MPhil/PhD degree in the designated subjects of Biotechnology, Bioinformatics,


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Chemistry, and Molecular Biology or any other branch of Life Sciences or Chemical Sciences.

- 4.2.2 CUHP will recognize CSIR-IHBT scientists, subject to the fulfilment of eligibility requirements as per the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the University, as supervisors for guiding research leading to MPhil/PhD degrees.
- 4.2.3 CUHP will, subject to the fulfilment of eligibility requirements as per the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the University, confer the status of Adjunct Professor, Adjunct Associate Professor and Adjunct Assistant Professor on CSIR-IHBT scientists, depending upon their qualifications and designations, involved in collaborative research and teaching with CUHP.
- 4.2.4 CUHP shall provide access to Library and research facilities to the scientists and PhD students of CSIR-IHBT and that they shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the University as applicable to the faculty and research scholars of the University.

#### 4.3 Responsibility of CSIR-IHBT

- 4.3.1 CSIR-IHBT shall provide access to its Library and research facilities to the students and faculty members of concerned schools of the CUHP and that they shall be governed by the rules and regulations as applicable to the CSIR-IHBT Scientists.
- 4.3.2 CSIR-IHBT will provide summer training, research facilities to students (not more than 10 at a time) and CSIR-IHBT scientists will help in the preparation of teaching material for these students.
- 4.3.3 CSIR-IHBT shall arrange Hostel/Guest House accommodation for Central University of Himachal Pradesh students coming for summer trainings subject to availability of accommodation and in accordance to the guidelines for accommodation charges by CSIR-IHBT.





4.3.4 CSIR-IHBT Scientists recognised by the CUHP as Adjunct Professor, Adjunct Associate Professor and Adjunct Assistant Professor will be permitted to be involved in teaching and evaluation of students' performance in theory as well as practical classes in the CUHP.

#### 4.4 Collaborative Research Degree (MPhil/PhD) Programme

- 4.4.1 CSIR-IHBT and the CUHP shall, subject to their rules and regulations and through mutual consultation, evolve a collaborative Research Degree (MPhil/PhD) programme.
- 4.4.2 Modalities of the collaborative research degree programme shall be worked out by the two organisation through mutual consultations and with due regard to the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the CUHP and the rules and regulations governing the CSIR-IHBT.

#### 5. Areas of Collaborative Research

5.1 Areas of collaborative research shall be worked out mutually between the two parties keeping in view the research needs and priorities of the two parties and also depending upon the research expertise and research facilities available in the CSIR-IHBT and the CUHP.

#### 6. Co-ordination & Progress Review Committee (CPRC)

- 6.1 It is agreed that the progress of this MOU shall be monitored by a Review Committee comprising Vice-Chancellor of the CUHP and the Director, CSIR-IHBT through periodic meetings.
- 6.2 Director of the CSIR-IHBT and Dean of the School concerned from CUHP would be the coordinators for activities under this MoU.





#### 7. Financial Terms

7.1 There shall be no financial obligations on the part of the CSIR-IHBT and CUHP. Expenditures related to sample preparation, and experimentation would be borne by respective labs at their own end.

#### 8. No Liability Clause

- 8.1 CSIR-IHBT shall not be responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever, resulting due to implementation of any technology at the premises of CUHP or CSIR-IHBT, or due to testing of the same at the premises of CUHP or CSIR-IHBT.
- 8.2 CUHP shall not be responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever, resulting due to implementation of any technology at the premises of CUHP or CSIR-IHBT, or due to testing of the same at the premises of CUHP or CSIR-IHBT.

#### 9. Confidentiality Clause

- 9.1 Both the parties acknowledge the confidentiality of the information, which may be transferred between the parties or obtained or developed during the course of this exchange from time to time as being essential to this MoU and agree not to disclose the same to any third party. However, each party shall be free to disclose this information as is:
  - 9.1.1 In the public domain at the time of disclosure.
  - 9.1.2 Required to be disclosed by official authorities in accordance with applicable law or regulation.
- 9.2 While the parties agree to co-operate and otherwise act in good faith with the view to the successful implementation, there is no financial binding on either party. This MoU is intended to mutual understanding of the parities hereto as at the date thereof.

- Any notice, request or other communication required or permitted to be given 9.3 under this MoU shall be in writing and shall be delivered in person or by recognized courier service or facsimile, or to the authorized persons of two organisation to be notified separately.
- Each of the parties recognizes that the successful implementation of this 9.4 MOU to the mutual satisfaction and benefit of both the parties will require a significant degree of cooperation and good faith on behalf of both the parties. Each of the parties resolves to act in good faith and in accordance with the spirit of this MOU to implement the provisions in accordance with the mutual desire and in the interests of the parties.
- Both the parties undertake not to transfer, for any consideration to be 9.5 received by it, the know-how/data obtained through this MoU to any other party in any manner whatsoever without prior written approval of each other whether within and beyond the period of this MoU. Both the parties shall take all necessary measures to ensure that the knowledge/data obtained under this MoU is not passed on or disclosed to any third party.
- While the parties agree to co-operate and otherwise act in good faith with the 9.6 view for successful implementation, there is no financial binding on either party. This MoU is intended to mutual understanding of the parities hereto as at the date thereof.

#### **Publications** 10.

- 10.1 Publications, if any, in respect of the development of the know-how as envisaged with the prior mutual consent of the two parties shall be in the names of the investigators. Prior publications will be avoided where a patent or patents may possibly be taken.
- 10.2 Publications, if any in respect of the said studies will be with the prior mutual consent of CSIR-IHBT and CUHP and shall be in the names of both the parties/suitability acknowledged by CSIR-IHBT/CUHP.

10.3 Prior publications will be avoided where a patent or patents may possibly be taken.

#### 11. Protection & Disposition of Ownership of Intellectual Property Rights

- 11.1 The ownership of all Background Information and Background Intellectual Property Rights generated by the parties prior to the MoU shall rest with the respective parties. However, parties shall have right to use such Background Information and Background Intellectual Property Rights for the purposes of the R&D work performed under the MoU.
- 11.2 All Foreground Information and Foreground Intellectual Property Rights created during the R&D work performed under the MoU shall be owned jointly by the parties.
- 11.3 Parties to this MoU shall confer and consult each other regarding filing of Intellectual Property Rights applications including patent applications covering Foreground Information and share equally the attendant expenditure related to filing, prosecution, grant, maintenance etc. of the same.
- 11.4 In the event of any extraordinary situation including infringement suits filed by third parties, parties shall initiate any action in mutual consultation and agreement.

#### 12. Patent & Patent Infringement

12.1 If the know-how developed as a result of a study undertaken under this MoU leads to a patent or patents being taken, the parties hereto shall mutually agree whether or not to apply for a patent/s and if so in which country. Patents taken, if any, will be in joint names of the two parties. The cost of taking out a patent shall be borne by CSIR-IHBT or CUHP.

- 12.2 In the event of any claim or action being brought against either party to this MoU alleging infringement of a patent of a third party, the parties hereto shall mutually decide whether to defend the claim or not. The cost of defence against any such claims or action shall be borne by the two parties hereto.
- 12.3 In the event of patents being filed, out of the research work of a student working at CSIR-IHBT for MPhil/PhD thesis under the sole supervision of scientist(s) from the IHBT, the CUHP shall have no claim to IPRs.
- 12.4 In the event of patents being filed, out of the research work of a student working at CUHP for MPhil/PhD thesis under the sole supervision of faculty member(s) of the CUHP, the CSIR-IHBT shall have no claim to IPRs.
- 12.5 In the event of a patent being filed, out of the research work of a student working at CSIR-IHBT for MPhil/PhD thesis under the joint supervision of the scientist(s) and faculty member(s) of the CUHP, the cost of patenting and any monetary benefits accruing subsequent of filing and maintaining the patents will be shared by CSIR-IHBT and CUHP on equal basis.
- 12.6 In the event of a patent being filed out of the collaborative research work between the faculty members of CUHP and the scientists of CSIR-IHBT the cost of patenting and monetary benefits accruing subsequent to filing and maintaining of the patents will be shared by CUHP and CSIR-IHBT on equal basis.

#### 13. MoU and its Amendments

13.1 This MoU shall be the principal repository of the terms and conditions agreed to between the parties and no amendment thereof shall take effect or be binding on both the parties unless such amendment is authorized by them and is recorded in writing and signed by the duly authorized representatives of both the parties.

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#### 14. Termination

- 14.1 In case it is found by the two parties that the desired objectives cannot be achieved due to any reason(s) whatsoever, this MoU will be treated as terminated by a mutually agreed procedure without any liability on either of the party.
- 14.2 However the MPhil and PhD students admitted under the collaborative research supervision shall continue to be governed by the same terms and conditions till the completion of their degrees in accordance with the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the CUHP.

#### 15. Force Majeure

15.1 Neither party shall be held responsible for non-fulfilment of their respective obligation under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the force majeure events, such as, but not limited to Acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquakes, Strike(s), Lockout(s), Epidemics, Riots, Civil commotion etc provided on occurrence and cessation of such events, the party affected by these shall give a notice in writing to the other party within one month of such occurrence and cessation. If the majeure conditions continue beyond six months, the parties shall then mutually decide about the future course of action.

#### 16. Arbitration

- 16.1 Except as otherwise provided elsewhere in the MoU, in the event of any dispute or difference relating to, arising from or connected with the MoU such dispute or difference shall be resolved between the parties by mutual consultation and to the satisfaction of both the parties.
- 16.2 If amicable settlement cannot be reached within 30 days from the date of the occurrence of the dispute, the matter under dispute shall be finally settled without recourse to the courts, in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and amendments thereto, if any.



16.3 The Arbitration shall be conducted by the Arbitrator(s) appointed by the mutual consent of both the parties in accordance with the Rules of the said Act. The arbitral award shall be final and binding. The arbitration proceedings shall be held at Chandigarh.

#### 17. Hold Harmless

- 17.1 The IHBT agrees to hold CUHP harmless from any claim or damages arising from the IHBT's performance of work under this contract. IHBT shall also hold CUHP harmless without any limitation from any claims or damages raised or damages suffered by the IHBT.
- 17.2 The CUHP agrees to hold CSIR-IHBT harmless from any claim or damages arising from the CUHP's performance of work under this contract. CUHP shall also hold CSIR-IHBT harmless without any limitation from any claims or damages raised or damages suffered by the CUHP.

This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into on 2° Today of December 2016 between the NATIONAL COUNCIL OF RURAL INSTITUTES, Ministry of Human Resources Development Govt. of India Hyderabad represented by the Chairman hereafter to be called the FIRST PARTY and the CENTRAL UNIVERSITY OF HIMACHAL PRADESH, Dharmashala represented by the Vice Chancellor, here-after to be called 'SECOND PARTY'

The National Council of Rural Institutes (NCRI) aims at Human Resource Development and Capacity Building of Universities and Higher Educational Institutions in the country. Established in 1995 by the Government of India under the Union Ministry of Human Resource Development, the NCRI seeks to usher in academic i.e., teaching-learning and research activity focused on issues of concern to rural India. Its HRD endeavors and instruments of development include curriculum development, curriculum transaction, curriculum standardization and curriculum accreditation with workshop, material development, teaching, research, action research, advocacy and hand-holding of academic activities focused on rural concerns.

The NCRI interfaces with universities and institutes of higher learning even while collaborating and converging with the objectives of educational and academic infrastructure that can make a lasting difference to the life and living standards of the rural India. HRD is our operational framework and Human Development is the goal.

Development of backward areas and their representative institutions, boosting the flagship social and rural programmes with focus on education, employment, livelihoods and rural

resilience building comprise the core initiatives. Developing a committed and competent cadre of Academic Professionals interested in rural issues is another major objective of NCRI. These Professionals are expected to streamline and deliver education effectively and efficiently with emphasis on inclusion and regional prosperity. The Council seeks to empower the rural education and the academics manning them. Empowerment of the people will be a well designed corollary.

The NCRI aims at forging academic partnerships and networks with Central Universities and National Institutionsas well as cutting edge public organizations. Emerging opportunities for strengthening Social Development and Economic Growth initiatives in the rural areas are identified with a view to promoting participatory development. Capacity building and professionalization of Rural Academic activity, entrepreneurship, livelihoods, community initiatives, creativity of local groups and proactive development action constitute the core content of NCRI's research and capacity building programmes and field interventions.

The Central University of Himachal Pradeshat Dharamshala is set up under the Central University of Himachal Pradesh Act 2009 enacted by the Parliament. The university is funded and regulated by the UGC. Among the objectives of the university are to train manpower for the development of the country; to make special provision for integrated courses in humanities social sciences, science and technology in its educational programs and to pay special attention to the improvement of social and economic conditions and welfare of the people, their intellectual academic and cultural development. University offers a unique course namely Community Lab to students where students interact with village Communities, Collect socioeconomic data and prepare reports which is in consonance with a step towards realizing Mahatma Gandhi's dream of making rural India the focal point of holistic development.

The objective of the partnership is to fulfill a common vision of collaborative academic activity. Promotion of education and employability of unemployed rural and tribal youth belonging to Below Poverty Line (BPL) families will also be a top priority.



In addition to the above objectives, both the parties are desirous of establishing a working relationship to provide guidance and research for building resilient rural India. The first and second parties will collaboratively conduct the workshops with shared faculty and materials resources as mutually agreed upon.

### The Functions and Responsibilities of the First Party (NCRI) are as follows:

- The first party will run a set of workshops collaboratively in line with the workshop framework and as per the instructions agreed upon.
- The first party shall be responsible for all clearances related to workshops that may be required from time to time including programme content and cost.
- The first party shall arrange Stationery, Participant badges, Workshop Participation Certificates and workshop related material to the participants.
- The first party shall make payment of TA/DA to each participant, catering and other logistics on mutually agreed terms by the second party from the funds released by the first party.
- The first party team expenses shall be borne by NCRI. The team will function under the overall supervision and guidance of the NCRI in all matters relating to workshop content management, communication and documentation.
- 6. The programme administration (design, communication and management) costs @Rs 40,000 for 2 day programme will be paid by the first party. This includes the cost of reporting the workshop proceedings in one hard and one soft copy.

### The Functions and Responsibilities of the Second Party (CUHP) are as follows:

 The second party owns the campus (buildings) at TAB Shahpur, Dharamshala, Himachal Pradesh where the workshops will take place and also at other locations mutually decided from time to time at different places in the State.

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- The second party will make available their existing infrastructure i.e, Classrooms, Hostel
  and Guest House, Library, Computers, Printer, LCD Projectors, PAS, Chairs, Tables, etc
  for the workshops to be conducted in collaboration with the first party.
- Both parties also agree that the first party can bring and return relevant workshop material as and when required.
- 4. The second party will take care of the maintenance and upkeep of the building i.e. housekeeping, security, sanitation, fire extinguishers, water, electricity, furniture, any repairs and (chairs, tables, almirahs, white boards, fans, and light fittings) and employee expenses for those involved in the above tasks.
- The second party shall enable the first party to use the premises as agreed to and required, library, computer labs and plan and run workshop programs.
- 6. One Research Scholar who will be called as NCRI Fellow pursuing either M Phil (1year) or Ph D (4 years) will be selected for scholarship/fellowship every year for financial support by NCRI. The aspects of research mutually identified by both parties in relevant aspects of rural studies will be announced before the admission and selection process is initiated annually. The aspects of research mutually identified by both parties in relevant aspects of rural studies related to any programs run by various departments and centres of the university and will be announced before the admission and selection process is initiated annually. The amount of fellowship and process of reporting will be on the lines of UGC Junior Research Fellowship. The scholar selected shall publish 2 articles in every academic year, during the period of scholarship, in reputed journals focusing on rural issues.
- The second party shall maintain the records like participant database which shall be shared with the first party on programme basis.
- 8. The second party shall provide the facilities amenities to the participants?
- The second party shall facilitate the first party to take the photographs and make films and documentaries of the workshops.



- 10. The second party shall procure the workshop resource materials and books in consultation with first party on the aspects found relevant by both parties for which funds will be provided by the first party.
- 11. The second party shall take the responsibility of the participant discipline during the workshop hours and in the hostels.
- 12. The second party shall arrange the display of workshop announcement/banner/poster and information in CUHP Campus for the workshops (Name of both the parties will be mentioned).
- 13. The programme administration will be done by the second party such as design, communication and management. The cost of Rs 40,000 for 2 day programme will be borne by the first party this includes the cost of reporting the workshop proceedings in one hard and one soft copy.
- 14. The honorarium for resource persons, documentation, travel, food and accommodation expenses of the participants from outside CUHPwill be borne by the first party and arranged by the second party separately for each programme.

#### Payment Process:

The payments, as mutually agreed upon, shall be made within 15 days of submission of report through RTGS/NEFT by NCRI.

For effective implementation and monitoring of the scheme as envisaged in the MoU, Chairman NCRI or his nominee will be the Nodal Officer on behalf of the "FIRST PARTY" & Vice Chancellor CUHP, Himachal Pradesh or Nomineewill be the Nodal Officer on behalf of the "SECOND PARTY".

Unless otherwise terminated by written Agreement between the parties, or in terms of this agreement, this agreement will remain in force by the end of the academic year 2019-20 and may be renewed by mutual consent.

Notwithstanding the provision of above clause, either party shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement immediately and without further notice in the event of the other party



committing a material breach of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and failing to remedy such breach within 60 (Sixty) days after receipt of written notice calling upon such party to remedy the breach complaint. In WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this agreement to be made in English and executed by their respective duly authorized representatives of the day and the year first written.

Both the parties will facilitate wider dissemination of this collaborative initiative and its impacts. The Certification, all signage, press releases and communication will include the names of both the parties. All disputes are subject to jurisdiction of the court at Hyderabad.

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) will be effective from to end of academic year 2019-20 and renewable with the mutual consent of both the parties for a similar period.

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



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING between Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) and University Grants Commission (UGC) for the year 2019-20.

This is a tri-Partite Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) being signed among Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), University Grants Commission (UGC)

and

the third party, Central University of Himachal Pradesh, (hereinafter referred to as University)

With the objective to assess and facilitate the performance of the University on selected key parameters against the targets set so as to incrementally improve the performance of the University.

#### PART 1 <u>VISION, MISSION AND OBJECTIVES</u>

#### 1.1 Vision

The vision of the University is to establish itself as centre of excellence with social commitment by integrating modern, scientific and technological knowledge and skills with the basic human ethics and values. The University shall set forth a model in teaching, research and personality development and create skilled human resource with a sense of responsiveness towards society, the country and the world at large.

#### 1.2 Mission

The mission of the University is to provide access to quality education and create opportunities for encouraging students to effectively engage with emerging innovations and technological challenges, international competitiveness and leadership in through as well as in action. The University is also conscious of the importance of developing entrepreneurial and scholastic abilities for creation of knowledge, wealth and prosperity for the country as well as peace and happiness for human beings.

#### 1.3 Objectives (as defined in the Central Universities Act, 2009)

- 1.3.1 To disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities in such branches of learning as it may deem fit:
- 1.3.2 To make special provisions for integrated courses in humanities, social sciences, science and technology in its educational programmes;
- 1.3.3 To take appropriate measures for promoting innovations in teaching-learning process and inter-disciplinary studies and research;

- 1.3.4 To educate and train manpower for the development of the country;
- 1.3.5 To establish linkages with industries for promotion of science and technology;
- 1.3.6 To pay special attention to the improvement of the social and economic conditions and welfare of the people, their intellectual, academic and cultural development.

# PART 2 EXERCISE OF ENHANCED AUTONOMY AND DELEGATION OF FINANCIAL POWERS

- 2.1 All such powers are available to the Executive Council (EC) of the University as are provided for by the Act and Statutes as well as ordinances framed thereunder. The EC shall not use its power to lay down any policy that has an overriding or overruling impact on the University's Act.
- 2.2 The University shall endeavour to ensure gradual annual increase in the user charges / fees charged by it for its various courses and facilities.
- 2.3 The University shall strictly follow the General Financial Rules, 2017 issued by Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, Government of India in all its financial transactions including procurement of goods and services.
- 2.4 The University shall adopt the Public Financial Management System (PFMS) for receipt of all funds from UGC / Government of India and make all payments through the PFMS till the last mile as far as possible.
- 2.5 The University shall send to the MHRD and UGC any information required by it to satisfy any requirement related to Parliamentary Matters, RTI, Court Cases, Public Grievances or inputs for policy decisions to be taken by the UGC/MHRD within reasonable time specified by the UGC/MHRD.
- 2.6 In addition to the above, such decisions which create financial liabilities on UGC/ MHRD shall be taken up by the University with the prior approval of UGC / MHRD.
- 2.7. In fulfilment of its obligations under the MoU, the University shall undertake to achieve certain level of performance for the year 2019-20. The performance will be assessed based on the information provided by the University as per the criteria listed in the **Annexure** enclosed.

### PART 3 FACILITATION /ASSISTANCE FROM THE GOVERNMENT/UGC

3.1. The University has made the commitment of Performance Evaluation Targets based on certain assumptions in respect of release of grants from Government/UGC and raising funds from other resources, including loan from HEFA for expansion of infrastructural facilities, which has a direct bearing on the performance of the University of

UGC/MHRD will extend any other facilitation/assistance like taking up the matters with the State Government concerned or any Ministry/ Department of the Union Government, as and when required.

#### PART 4 ACTION PLAN FOR IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING OF THE MoU

- 4.1 Performance evaluation against these MoU parameters shall be carried out every six months and monitored by the University.
- 4.2 The performance evaluation so carried out shall be submitted to the EC of the University during its meetings for consideration after which the same shall be sent to UGC along with its recommendations.
- 4.3 A joint review by the University, UGC and MHRD shall be carried out within 180 days of completion of the financial year. The result of the joint review shall be placed before the EC and hosted prominently on the website of the University.

#### PART 5 REQUIREMENT FROM THE UGC AND MHRD

The University shall submit detailed proposal along with detailed justifications to UGC/MHRD, duly approved and recommended by its Finance Committee/EC. UGC/MHRD may liberally consider release of funds as per given justifications. Besides, UGC/MHRD will also provide administrative support and permissions wherever required as per the provisions of the Central Universities Act, 2009.

On the other hand the Library of Tibetan Works and Archives, situated at Gangchen Kyishong, Dharamsala, District Kangra, Himachal Pradesh, India hereinafter referred to as LTWA, represented by its Director, Venerable Geshe Lhakdor.

WHEREAS, CUHP and LTWA realise the mutual benefits of joining efforts to achieve the purposes set forth below.

WHEREAS, CUHP strives for inclusive access to excellence in higher education and research to emerge as a premier university of the country at par with the best universities of the world in terms of programme offerings, curricular framework, pedagogy, research, publications and integration with the world of work.

WHEREAS, LTWA strives to provide a comprehensive Tibetan study resource centre and to provide an environment that encourages research and an exchange of knowledge and experience between scholars, colleges and students from various disciplines.

**THEREFORE**, the parties hereto have decided to enter into this MoU pursuant to the following clauses and conditions:

#### **CLAUSE ONE - PURPOSE**

The MoU entered into hereunder shall promote, develop and bring about educational-scientific cooperation, in matters of reciprocal interest of the signatory parties, which shall in due time be defined in a specific document to be signed by the parties.

#### **CLAUSE TWO - FORM OF EXECUTION**

For the purpose of this MoU, the parties hereby commit themselves, within their respective scope of responsibilities, in providing technical, administrative, financial and operational support for the activities that shall be developed, in particular:

- a) Promoting and fostering exchange programs, courses, seminars, internships and other activities of common interest, in accordance with the possibilities of each of the convening parties.
- b) Productively carrying out educational programmes and activities for participants from either party, in accordance with the potential of either of the programme organizing parties.
- c) Cooperating in planning and implementing exchange programmes and activities of common and reciprocal interest.
- d) In conclusion of any programme and activity, parties shall jointly prepare a consolidated report of the results achieved from programme and activity convened, pursuant to this MoU.
- e) The parties in this matter shall appoint a responsible programme coordinator, who shall carry out the programmes and activities and manage the intellectual properties for the partnerships established from the MoU.

#### **CLAUSE THREE - OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES**

The parties shall further commit themselves to:

- a) Accepting, complying with, and determining that participants also comply with, all legislation, norms, and technical and administrative instructions of both the parties.
- b) Contributing, by carrying out the actions and fulfilling the objectives set forth in the Programmes and activities, to the better performance and result of this MoU.
- c) Ensuring the timely execution of the Programmes and activities.

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- d) Integrate physical and human resources necessary for the better performance of the programmes and activities.
- e) Fully complying with the participants' statutory and normative purposes, so as to safeguard their rights and prerogatives.
- f) Informing all irregularities which might occur during the programme's development and execution to the programme coordinator on a regular basis.
- g) Ensuring the coordinator and other persons appointed for the programme, full access to inspect the development of the programme.

#### **CLAUSE FOUR - FINANCIAL RESOURCES**

Expenses resulting from this MoU towards organising programme or activity shall be borne jointly by the parties. Written consents from both the parties for each programme or activity proposed is required where all the terms and conditions of the financial expenses must also be mentioned clearly.

#### **CLAUSE FIVE - DURATION**

This Memorandum of Understanding shall be effective for five years as of the date of its signature and may be extended upon amendment and agreed upon by both the parties.

#### **CLAUSE SIX - TERMINATION**

This MoU may be terminated upon agreement by the parties or unilaterally by any of parties, provided that the interested party notifies the other party, in writing, before ninety days of the effective date of the termination of this MoU, and that such termination does not negatively affect any on-going activities till their conclusions.

#### **CLAUSE SEVEN - IRREVOCABILITY**

Any forbearance of the parties hereto with respect to violations of any clauses or conditions of this MoU shall be construed as mere liberality, and under no







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circumstances whatsoever shall it result in novation, modification, waiver, or loss of the right to enforce any such obligations, pursuant to the amendment in connection herewith.

#### **CLAUSE EIGHT - AMENDMENTS**

This MoU may be changed only upon agreement by both the parties and legally drafted by an amendment in connection therewith.

### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU)

# INFORMATION AND LIBRARY NETWORK (INFLIBNET) CENTRE AN IUC OF UGC, GANDHINAGAR

This Memorandum of Understanding hereinafter referred to as MoU is signed on this 4th day of July in the year 2017 between the Central University of Himachal Pradesh. P.O. Box – 21, Dharamshala, District – Kangra, Himachal Pradesh – 176 215, hereinafter called "CUHP" which expression unless otherwise provided, shall include its successor of assignees on the one part and Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) CENTRE, An Inter University Centre of the University Grants Commission, Gandhinagar hereinafter referred to as "INFLIBNET", on the other part.

CUHP and INFLIBNET shall hereinafter be referred to singularly as the "party" and jointly as "the parties".

CUHP strives for Inclusive Access & Excellence in Higher Education & Research and is at par with the best Universities of the world in terms of programme offering curricular framework, pedagogy, research publications & integration. Presently it is having 11 School of Studies with different departments and is engaged in undergraduate and postgraduate studies and MPhil / PhD programs.

**INFLIBNET** Centre, set up in 1991 as a Project of IUCAA, has graduated to be the Inter University Centre of the University Grants Commission in 1996.

#### 1. Preamble

Whereas the International Academic Community have realised the need for a close linkage between different centres of higher learning based on principles of equality & reciprocity of mutual benefits the CUHP and INFLIBNET hereby express a desire to join hands in the sphere of academic and research programs, exchange of faculty, scientists, research students, joint information tools and product development and other allied fields as per the following terms & conditions:

#### 2. Recitals

- 2.1 AND WHEREAS both the CUHP and INFLIBNET recognise that they share common goals and are desirous to establish a cooperative arrangement towards sharing of knowledge and research through mutual resource sharing.

  The parties shall at all times for the common benefit of the parties agree to use their best endeavour to ensure the success of this Memorandum of Understanding.
- 2.2 AND WHEREAS both organisations are desirous to associate in all other related areas as may be agreed upon for furtherance of knowledge based enterprises, apt technical and management skills for future technology development, information exchange and work towards innovative and effective research, academic partnerships for Human Resource Development and R&D.





2.3 NOW THE PARTIES (CUHP AND INFLIBNET) hereby acknowledge and agree to collaborate on collaborative and joint research work by entering into this MoU covering the activities as detailed below:

#### 3. Period of MoU and its Extension

- 3.1 This MoU comes into effect from the date of its signing & shall remain in force till the completion of five (05) years subject to review and modification as mutually agreed upon.
- 3.2 Thereafter if the parties hereto wish to extend the terms of this MoU, they shall do so by an express covenant in writing.
- 3.3 Notwithstanding anything, either party may terminate this MoU by notifying the other party to its intention to terminate this MoU by a notice in writing, at least three (03) months prior to its termination date. Termination shall be without penalty.

#### 4. Scope of MoU

- 4.1 The primary objective of the proposed Memorandum of Understanding is to start a collaborative doctoral research programme wherein the students will enrol themselves for their Ph.D. programs as per regulations with the Central University of Himachal Pradesh and conduct their research work at the INFLIBNET Centre or at both the institutions after completion of the period required for course work at CUHP.
- 4.2 The collaborative research programme proposed by the INFLIBNET Centre in collaboration with the Department of Library and Information Science, the Department of Computer Science and Informatics, Central University of Himachal Pradesh would be mutually beneficial for both the organizations.
- 4.3 The research work undertaken in the collaborative programme would preferably be taken in the areas of direct interest to the INFLIBNET Centre or Central University of Himachal Pradesh. Such research is likely to result into tangible products/software having applications in libraries and information centres. Such products would be made available to the Central University of Himachal Pradesh for their applications in their Central Library or in the Department of Library and Information Science or in any other Department or School of the University free of cost.
- 4.4 The existing products and services of the INFLIBNET Centre such as SOUL software would also be given to the Central Library or to the Department of Library and Information Science, Central University of Himachal Pradesh for teaching and research purposes under this collaborative arrangement free of cost.
- 4.5 The INFLIBNET Centre will extend its facilities, services and infrastructure to the faculty and research students of the Department of Library & Information Sciences, the Department of Computer Science and Informatics as well as to the Central Library, Central University of Himachal Pradesh for research and academic activities.
- 4.6 The INFLIBNET Centre and the Department of Library & Information Science, the Department of Computer Science and Informatics, Central University of Himachal Pradesh may write joint projects for sponsorship from various funding agencies.



- 4.7 The faculty and Scientists from both the institutions under the exchange programme may be deputed for a period of one to four weeks for delivering talks as well as for collaborative work.
- 4.8 The INFLIBNET Centre would extend its hosting facility and other infrastructural of the Data Centre to the Central University of Himachal Pradesh free of cost.

#### 5. Eligibility and Selection of Research Students and Approval of Research Topics

- 5.1 The eligibility of the students would be as per the Ordinance of the Central University of Himachal Pradesh. The approval of research topics would also be as per Ordinances of the University.
- 5.2 The INFLIBNET Centre proposed to have two or more scholarship (JRF/SRF) in the area of Library and Information Sciences to be awarded to research students in the field of Library and Information Sciences. Admission to the Ph.D. program will be as per laid down procedure in the Ordinances of Central University of Himachal Pradesh as amended from time to time.
- 5.2 In cases of research scholar enrolling under the guidance of co-supervisor from the INFLIBNET Centre, such specialist will have to be approved by the University bodies as per Ordinances of the University as amended from time to time.
- 5.3 The INFLIBNET employees who wish to enrol for Ph.D. at Central University of Himachal Pradesh can have Supervisor from Central University of Himachal Pradesh and one co-supervisor from INFLIBNET Centre. The Director, INFLIBNET Centre, and other Scientists equivalent to the grade pay of Assistant Professor and above will be recognized as co-supervisor provided that they meet Central University of Himachal Pradesh requirements for research supervision and have requisite qualification to supervisor Doctoral level research.
- 5.4 The collaborative research programme would be announced through the websites of the INFLIBNET Centre as well as Central University of Himachal Pradesh.

#### 6. Coordination and Progress Review Committee (CPRC)

- 6.1 It is agreed that the progress of this MoU shall be monitored by a Review Committee comprising the Vice-Chancellor of CUHP and the Director of INFLIBNET through periodic meetings.
- 6.2 Director (Research) of CUHP and Director, INFLIBNET Centre shall be the coordinators for activities under this MoU.

#### 7. Financial Implications for Intellectual property

7.1 Any intellectual property developed on collaborative research conducted under this MoU or any contracts pertaining to fee for services rendered will be addressed on a case by case under separate agreements.

#### 8. No Liability Clause

8.1 CUHP and INFLIBNET shall not be responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever resulting due to implementation of any technology in the premises of the other.



#### 9. Confidentiality Clause

- 9.1 Both the parties acknowledge the confidentiality of the information, which may be transferred between the parties or obtained or developed during the course of this exchange from time to time as being essential to this MoU and agree not to disclose the same to any third party. However, each party shall be free to disclose the information as is:
  - 9.1.1 In the public domain at the time of disclosure.
  - 9.1.2 Required to be disclosed by official authorities in accordance with applicable law or regulation.
- 9.2 Any notice, request or other communication required or permitted to be given under this MoU shall be in writing and shall be delivered in person or by recognised courier service or facsimile, or to the authorized persons of two organisation to be notified separately.
- 9.3 Each of the parties recognises that the successful implementation of this MoU to the mutual satisfaction and benefit of both the parties will require a significant degree of cooperation and good faith on behalf of both the parties. Each of the parties resolves to act in good faith and in accordance with the spirit of this MoU to implement the provisions in accordance with the mutual desire and in the interests of the parties.
- 9.4 Both the parties undertake not to transfer, for any consideration to be received by it, the know-how / data obtained through this MoU to any other party in any manner whatsoever without the prior written approval of each other whether within and beyond the period of this MoU. Both the parties shall take all necessary measures to ensure that the knowledge / data obtained under this MoU is not passed on or disclosed to any third party without mutual consultation and consent in writing.

#### 10. Publications and Intellectual property rights

- 10.1 Publications, if any, in respect of the development of the know-how as envisaged with the prior mutual consent of the two parties shall be in the names of the investigators. Prior publications will be avoided where a patent or patents may possibly be taken.
- 10.2 Parties to this MoU shall confer and consult each other regarding filling of Intellectual Property Rights applications including patent applications covering Foreground Information and share equally the attendant expenditure related to filing, prosecution grant, maintenance etc. of the same.
- 10.3 In the event of any extra ordinary situation including infringement suits filed by third parties, parties shall initiate any action in mutual consultation and agreement.

#### 11. Patent and Patent Infringement

If the know-how developed as a result of a study undertaken under this MoU leads to a patent or patents being taken, the parties hereto shall mutually agree whether or not to apply for a patent/s and if so in which country. Patents taken, if any, will be in joint names of the two parties. The cost of taking out a patent shall be borne by CUHP and INFLIBNET jointly.







- 11.2 In the event of any claim or action being brought against either party to this MoU alleging infringement of a patent of a third party, the parties hereto shall mutually decide whether to defend the claim or not. The cost of defence against any such claims or action shall be borne by the two parities thereto.
- 11.3 If such a patent is filed under the joint supervision of CUHP/ INFLIBNET the cost of patenting and any monetary benefits accruing subsequent to filing and maintaining the patents will be shared by CUHP and INFLIBNET on equal basis.
- 11.4 In the event of a patent being filed out of the collaborative research work between the faculty members of CUHP and Scientists of INFLIBNET, the cost of patenting and monetary benefits accruing subsequent to filing and maintaining of the patents will be shared by CUHP and INFLIBNET on equal basis.

#### 12. Revision, Modification and Amendment of MoU

- 12.1 This MoU shall be the principal documents of the terms and conditions agreed to between the parties. However, either party may request in writing a revision, modification or amendment of all or any part of this MoU.
- 12.2 Any revision, modification or amendment agreed to by the parties shall be reduced into writing and shall form part of this MoU. They shall come into force on such date as may be determined by the parties by mutual agreement and shall out prejudice the rights and obligations arising from or based on this MoU before or upto the date of such change.

#### 13. Termination

- 13.1 In case it is found by the parties that the desired objectives cannot be achieved due to any reasons(s) whatsoever, this MoU will be treated as terminated by a mutually agreed procedure and shall be reduced in writing jointly without any liability on either party.
- 13.2 However even after termination, if MPhil / PhD students admitted under collaborative research supervision shall continue till the completion of their degrees in accordance with rules and regulations of CUHP and INFLIBNET.
- 13.3 Notwithstanding anything any party may terminate this MoU by notifying the other its intention to terminate in writing at least three (O3) months prior to termination date. Termination shall be without penalty.

#### Force Majeure

14.1 Neither party shall be held responsible for non-fulfilment of their respective obligation under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the force majeure events, such as, but not limited to Acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquakes, Strikes, Lockouts, Epidemics, Riots, Civil Commotion etc. provided on occurrence and cessation of such events, the party affected by these shall give a notice in writing to the other party within one month of such occurrence and cessation. If the majeure conditions continue beyond six months, the parties shall then mutually decide about the future course of action.





#### 15. Settlement of Disputes

15.1 Any difference or dispute between the parties concerning the interpretation and / or application of any of the provision of this MoU shall be settled amicably through mutual consultation and or negotiations between the parties without reference to any third party.

#### 16. Hold Harmless

16.1 CUHP and INFLIBNET agree to hold harmless from any claim or damages arising from the performance of the other during work under this contract. Without any limitation.

#### 17. Notices

17.1 Any communications under this MoU shall be in writing in the English Language and shall be delivered by registered mail or sent through electronic mail only by authorised and competent authority and shall be duly acknowledged by the other.

#### AND

Central University of Himachal Pradesh for implementation of Programs through the Vice-Chancellor, Central University of Himachal Pradesh (hereafter referred to as Party of the Third Part).

AND WHEREAS the First and Second Party are a statutory humanitarian organization established in 1920 by the Parliament under Indian Red Cross Society Act, XV of 1920. It is the largest statutory humanitarian organization with a network of 36 states/UT branches and more than 1100 branches at District & Sub-district.

AND WHEREAS the First and Second Party work to provide Aid to the sick and wounded members of the Armed forces of the Union in accordance with the terms and spirit of the Geneva Conventions of the 12<sup>th</sup> August, 1949 and discharged of other obligations developing upon the Society under the conventions as the recognized auxiliary of the Armed Forces Medical services, Aid to demobilised sick and wounded members of the Armed Forces of the Union, Nursing and Ambulance work, relief for the mitigation of the suffering caused by epidemics, earthquakes, famines, floods and other disasters, whether in India or outside, the improvement of health, prevention of disease and mitigation of suffering and such other cognate objects as may be approved by the society from time to time.

AND WHEREAS the Third Party is an Institution of national importance setup by the Indian Government with its campuses at Dharamshala, Shahpur and Dehra, Kangra, District Himachal Pradesh. It is one of the fifteen Universities setup by Central University Act, 2009. The University currently has 12 schools and 32 department/centres. It has 07 undergraduate courses, 24 post graduate courses and 29 Doctoral courses.

AND WHEREAS the Third party has grown steadily and surely towards its vision to become renowned by catering to the needs of the society, both regionally and nationally.

AND WHEREAS the first and second party have agreed to collaborate with the Third party on the terms and conditions as noted hereinafter:

#### NOW THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSES AS UNDER:

- The term of collaboration between the First Party and Second Party on the one hand and the Third Party on the other shall be for a period of three year from the date of execution of this MOU.
- 2. That all three parties will work within the mandates of each organization and adhere to the broad principles of humanitarian action as followed by the Red Cross Movement worldwide, namely, Humanitarianism, Impartially, Neutrality, Independence . Voluntarism, Unity and Universality.

3. That the collaboration will be with the following broad objectives:

a. Building the resilience of communities to disaster and climate change.

 Strong emphasis on disaster risk management on natural, manmade hazards and related environmental, technological and health hazards and risk.

c. Preventing new risk, reducing existing risk and strengthening resilience.

- 4. That the focused areas of collaboration will be following:
  - i. Disaster risk reduction, mitigation and preparedness.
  - ii. Water sanitation and hygiene promotion (WASH).

iii. Climate change adaption.

- iv. Environmental management and restoration.
- v. Ecosystem based livelihood support.
- vi. Health and blood services.
- vii. Any other area of mutual interest
- 5. That all these parties will draw upon the strengths of each other which in case of the Indian Red Cross Society are its large volunteer base and first Medical responders and the expertise of implementation of community directed programmes on the areas of interest. For CUHP, it is the large multi-sectoral technical expertise, faculty with the capacity to evaluate components of the project being implemented by the Indian Red Cross Society as well as training programmes and projects undertaken by it that include community intervention components in the areas of humanitarian interest.
- 6. The Parties shall constitute a joint committee having representation of Third party equal to the combined representation of First and Second party, for administering the collaboration. The said committee shall work under the Chairmanship of the officer nominated by the Secretary General, Indian Red Cross Society and Co-Chairman nominated by the Vice-chancellor, CUHP. The committee shall inter-alia be entrusted with the task of preparing and designing the collaborative projects annually or on need basis, general administration, allocation of resources needed, if any including financial and other connected matters and any other matter for the smooth conduct of the collaboration.
- 7. The Term of the annual project will be as per calendar year and will commence from each year.
- The details of the programmes/projects for 2020 and 2021will be worked-out and agreed upon immediately after the signing of the MOU and will be based on mutual consent among the parties.
- 9. Any dispute in the conduct of the programme will be mutually discussed and decided by the Chairman and Co-Chairman of the committee set up and if necessary, by the Secretary General, IRCS and the Vice-Chancellor, CUHP, However, decisions relating to projects where the funding is from single organization/sourced by one organization will be decided by the head of that organization who in case of the, Indian Red Cross Society will be the Secretary General, IRCS and in case of CUHP will be the Vice-Chancellor, CUHP and whose decision shall be final and binding on the Parties /Joint Committee.



- 10. Either of the parties can exit from the collaboration by giving a written notice of three months, however, efforts will be made to complete any ongoing projects, under this MOU.



## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (the "MoU") is entered at Dr. Ambedkar International Centre, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi-110001.

#### Between

Dr. Ambedkar International Centre, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, 15 Janpath, New Delhi, including its successors, assignees and legal representatives (hereafter to be known as the First party).

#### And

Central University of Himachal Pradesh Kangra, Shahpur, Himachal Pradesh 176206 including its successors, assignees and legal representatives (hereafter to be known as the Second Party).

## BACKGROUND OF PARTIES

#### Genesis

The Prime Minister, in his address to the nation on August 15, 2007, announced the establishment of a Central University in each of the states that did not have a central university so far. Subsequently, 11th Plan provided for the establishment of 16 new Central Universities. Accordingly, the Central Universities Act 2009 (No. 25 of 2009) which received Presidential assent on 20th March 2009 provided for the establishment of Central University of Himachal Pradesh amongst others.

## Establishment

The Central University of Himachal Pradesh is established under the Central Universities Act 2009 (No. 25 of 2009) enacted by the Parliament. The University is funded and regulated by the University Grants Commission (UGC). The University became functional with the assumption of charge by the first Vice Chancellor on 20th January 2010.

# Dr. Ambedkar International Centre (DAIC)

Dr. Ambedkar International Centre (DAIC) at 15 Janpath, New Delhi was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India on 7<sup>th</sup> December 2017. It was envisaged that this Centre would be a Centre of Excellence for study, research, analysis and policy feed and advocacy in various fields of Social sector. It will work on reducing discrimination and exclusion, and monitor progress towards more inclusive societies. The Centre will also conduct training programmes for officers and entrepreneurs.

The main focus of the Centre will be to reduce Socio-political and Economic inequalities. Research in socio-economic field will be conducted by the scholars from select universities both in India and abroad to reduce discrimination and exclusion, monitor progress towards inclusion, design and conduct training programmes for creating entrepreneurship skills, and

Lart in house attachment for refresher programmes for officers, students, researchers, teachers and entrepreneurs. To meet the objectives of qualitative research, DAIC will focus on research works on Dr. Ambedkar and his Vision of Developed India, Transformational and Developmental Aspects of Buddhism, Policy Feed and Policy Advocacy and Sustainable Development and Livelihood through various activities in its schools. These researches will not only be used to support industry and business houses but also to back all branches related to social sciences aiming to uplift the life of people. DAIC will have its own infrastructure and divisions for achieving its aims and objectives.

#### 2. PURPOSE

The Parties recognize the benefits to be derived from increased collaboration, cooperation and interaction for the further promotion and understanding of high performance in research training, capacity building and organizing various programmes including conferences, seminars, symposia and lecture series. The purpose of this MOU is to define the areas for fundamental, applied academic research in which both the Parties desire to work together in future for their mutual benefit to foster a collaborative framework between DAIC and DU in the Field with a view to benefiting from each other's initiatives and working procedures and to support collaboration among the researchers associated with both the Parties.

#### 3. SCOPE

This MOU sets forth the intentions of the Parties for increased collaboration, cooperation and interaction and does not create any legally bound commitments. If the Parties later agree to undertake specific joint projects with legally bound obligations, they will develop separate written agreements for such projects, setting out each Party's contributions, deliverables.

## 4. THE PARTIES INTEND TO:

- Strengthen the ties between DAIC and academia to make collaborative efforts in the fields of research and training.
- II. Make joint efforts for creating a knowledge bank which may be used to facilitate scholars, researchers and policy makers and to co-supervising post-graduate (if required) and research students.
- III. Offer exchange of faculty to the mutual benefit of both institutions.
- IV. Exchange academic materials and publications.
- V. Conduct lecture programmes, seminars, symposiums, and other types of academic discussions and undertake joint research attachment of staff for purposes of curriculum development and review, attendance of courses, upgrading of teaching and research skills.
- VI. Conducting study tours and joint consultancy work.
- VII. Prepare ground for induction of technological knowhow of the industry and administration in academia for better research and policy feeds.
- VIII. Prepare a common ground for the industries, institutions, universities, organizations, ministries, research centers and agencies for sponsoring/awarding Page No.60

projects to DAIC and DU for activities related to academic and policy research and policy advocacy and capacity building for start-ups and entrepreneurships.

IX. Both DAIC and DU will be having rights on intellectual property and knowledge products created through collaborative efforts.

X. Provide free of cost mutual access to facilities available at their campus for purpose of fundamental academic research.

XI. Participation in experience-sharing and institution-building activities.

XII. Organize regular capacity building programmes in the form of national-level learning activities. This may, for example, include learning and support services for specialized projects and activities of Indian administration system.

XIII. Training for Indian academics, officers and professionals, especially in the areas of training and learning methodologies, research and policy analysis, administration, social justice and social and financial inclusion.

XIV. Research collaboration on emerging skill development and employment relations themes.

XV. Development of innovative learning platforms and education programmes with emphasis on low residency and learning at distance for workers and adult learners.

XVI. Organization of specific Learning and Policy Workshops around themes that form the major policy reform areas and development focus (otherwise called the 'Transformation Agenda') of the Government of India over the next 5 years.

A specific plan will be worked out for each activity; setting forth detailed arrangements for collaboration will be agreed. Terms and conditions for each visit or an assignment or such exchange, including those concerning salary, travel funding, health insurance, and housing will be worked out between DAIC and DU.

## 5. COORDINATION

Each institution shall appoint one member of its teaching/research faculty to coordinate the programme on its behalf. Further, a coordination committee consisting of a programme coordinator from DAIC, and a programme coordinator from the side of DU will periodically review and identify ways to strengthen cooperation between the two institutions.

# 6. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

Ownership of any intellectual property (including but not limited to confidential information, know-how, patents, copyrights, design rights, rights relating to computer software, and any other industrial or intellectual property rights) developed jointly during the course of this MOU shall be vested in both institutes party to this Memorandum. Both institutes shall have the joint right to determine the commercial exploitation and disposition of such intellectual property, and both institutes shall make joint applications for the registration of the same. Before any registration or commercialization of any intellectual property takes place, the institutes agree to reach a separate agreement covering issues such as exploitation rights and revenue sharing. Any publication regarding such intellectual property shall only be possible with the prior written consent of both institutes, such consent

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out of the collaborating activities for its own internal teaching, research, educational, clinical and publication purposes without the payment of royalties or other fees to the other party.



## TYPES OF COOPERATION

The parties agree to the following types of cooperation:

The major thrust areas which would be considered for any joint research and related activity will be as follows:

- I. All Areas related to Socio-economic Transformation.
- II. Policy Research and Advocacy in all areas of Social Science.
- III. Studies on Peace, Progress and Transformational Aspects of Buddhism.
- IV. All Areas of Sustainable Development and Livelihood.

## INDUSTRY-ORIENTED COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH

In case of industry or corporate sector collaborative research, both the parties agree to have collaborative efforts in the following types of research activities/projects-

- Research related to promoting innovation, entrepreneurship and start-up culture among students/faculty in the respective institution, industry/corporate sector.
- II. Collaborative research and consultancy that may lead the client or the two parties to devise methods for socio-economic transformation and sustainable development.
- III. DU may initiate PhD programs with the sponsorship from the industry/institutions and corporate sector as per the Institution's guidelines for students-teacher ratio. Professors/Associate Professors from DAIC will cosupervise the research programme.
- IV. The joint research projects i.e. between industry and University can be considered with funding from government funding agencies or the industry or both.
- V. To support research activities and to create strong bonds between the two parties (DAIC and DU) and the industries or corporate sector a proposal may be prepared for the creation of industrial chair for the duration of research project only. The duration of the Chair may sustain if the research project sustains. But in such case, the Chair may be competent to assist research project. In case the Chair cannot handle the project, it may be replaced by a competent one.
- VI. Later separate proposal may be prepared both by DU and DAIC and the same should be sent to the Ministry of Corporate Affairs/Micro Small and Medium Enterprises/Labour and Employment/ for financial help for establishment of a Chair of permanent nature.
- VII. Prepare training programmes for students and industrial staff.
- VIII. Provide visiting faculty/experts from industry for interaction with staff and trainees.

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- X. Start-up entrepreneurship programme. Course will be structured by DAIC & DU and implemented by the industries.
- X. Involvement of industry in Faculty Development Programmes (FDPs)
- XI. Rendering help for students' internships and placements
- XII. Guidance/mentoring in setting-up of Incubation Centre
- XIII. Help in setting-up Technology and Innovation Centre
- XIV. Prepare ground for seed funding by Industries for the companies incubating in the University technology incubator.
- XV. Invite industries for the catalyst program, that is, industry support for marketing and commercialization for any product, for the incubating companies.
- XVI. Help in setting-up Technology and Innovation Support Center Network, with the aim of mentoring the innovators (in the University) and help them manage their Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs).

## 8. SEPARATE PROVISIONS FOR PROJECTS

Any specific joint projects with legally binding obligations will be set forth in separate agreements. Such special agreements for research programmes will be mutually decided by both the parties.

Research products resulting from joint research (Industrial property, intellectual property, patents, reports, prototypes etc.) are to be shared, while research products resulting from one party's participation in the other party's research programme would belong to the party hosting the research programme. Though on the request of the other party the research hosting party may share the result with the approval of the competent authority.

## 9. MODE OF OPERATION

Both parties will provide necessary support for effective implementation of the MoU within the institutional rules and procedures.

This MoU shall be effective from the date it is signed by both the parties.

Within the broad framework of the MoU, Dr. Ambedkar International Centre and Central University of Himachal Pradesh, can work on joint research, academic exchanges, development of facilities etc.

Any financial commitment for joint activities under this MoU shall be subject to the approval by the Competent Authorities of the respective organizations.

The activities under this MoU shall be coordinated, monitored and recorded by an Internal Coordination Committee. Director, DAIC, shall be the internal coordinator from Dr. Ambedkar International Centre, New Delhi whereas an officer of the same level from Central University of Himachal Pradesh, will be the internal coordinator from CU Himachal Pradesh. The visitors will be bound by the rules and regulations, as well as the code of conduct of the host institution.

## NON DISCLOSURE

Either party shall not provide or disclose any confidential information related to the other party, acquired during the cooperation or exchange stated herein, to a third party.

## 11. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

This MoU places no financial obligations or supplementary funding commitments on either party. These activities will be defined through separate programme agreements, detailing the commitment of resources (financial or otherwise) required from each institution. Subsequent programme agreements must be approved in advance in writing by the authorized representatives from both Parties. Each Party will be responsible for its own costs in connection with all matters relating to collaborations under this MoU. Where possible and appropriate, the parties may also seek funding for collaborations from Government and related agencies.

This MoU is also a broad based understanding between the parties and does not place any financial liabilities on any of the parties. In case there is joint financial involvement between both the parties for any Workshop/Seminar/Conference, it would be decided on case to case basis in advance. In case of preparing knowledge/research reports, if it involves any financial liability, it would be decided mutually.

#### 12. VALIDITY

The Memorandum shall remain in force for a period of FIVE years commencing from effective date. Institutions may extend the term by written agreement signed by both the parties after review. This MoU may be terminated by either Party with advance written notice of at least thirty (30) days.

## 13. AMENDMENTS/MODIFICATIONS

This MoU may be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the representatives of both institutes.

#### 14. LEGAL EFFECT

This MoU, shall in all respects, be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Republic of India.

### 15. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In case, there be a dispute relating to any aspect of academic cooperation, interpretation and for application of the premises of this MoU, Director of DAIC and the signatory officer from DU will jointly resolve the dispute in a spirit of independence, mutual respect, and shared responsibility. Arbitration shall be conducted at New Delhi. The

Cusion of arbitrators so reached shall be final and binding on both the Parties. Principal language of arbitrator shall be English.



Each clause of this MoU is severable and if one clause is rendered illegal or is severed, it will not render the whole MoU illegal and all clauses, except the severed clause shall be valid and binding on both parties.

2. (Central University of Himachal Pradesh )(Hereinafter referred as CUHP)

RFR Foundation and (CUHP) are referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as "Parties". Both Parties have reached the following intent to collaboration as per below described articles of this MOU.

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#### ARTICLE 1: BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

- 1.1.1. Research for Resurgence Foundation is founded by voluntary organization Bharatiya Shikshan Mandal(hereinafter referred as RFR Foundation). The core objective of RFR Foundationis to bring paradigm shift in research outcome, research methodology and innovation-based technologies, ensuring Bharatiya prospective, philosophy and applicability.
- 1.1.2. TheRFR Foundationhas functional dimensions to strengthen and synchronize Research, Researchers, Resources and Reach.
- 1.1.3. The RFR Foundation is a multi-domain Research Institute and a network hub of research and allied activities in academics and industrial sector.

- 1.2.1. Central University of Himachal Pradesh (hereinafter referred as CUHP) is an University established by the Central Universities Act 2009 (No. 25 of 2009).
- 1.2.2. **CUHP**functions as per the provisions of the central University act and statute 2009 & Ordinances published by Central University of Himachal Pradesh.

#### 1.1 Vision and Mission:

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- 1.1.5. Establishing platform for converting strength & excellence in terms of infrastructure and human resource for betterment of educational systems across world.
- 1.2. To organize national, international events, program at mutually agreed interval.
- 1.3. To provide infrastructure, academic & technical Support in various activities organized by RFR Foundation, subject to availability.
- 1.4. Promote and support student(s), faculty(s) exchange programs.
- 1.5. Maintain respect and dignity among other Academic associates and Industrial associates of RFR Foundation.
- 1.6. Active participation in associate members' annual meetings organized by RFR Foundation.
- 1.7. To recognize RFRF as workplace for research including PhD studies and post-doctoral research.

# 2. The responsibilities and work for RFR Foundation:

- 2.1. To provide Title "Academic Associate"& its certification to CUHP.
- 2.2. To provide access to knowledge resource centre of RFR Foundation.
- 2.3. To facilitate CUHP forindustry-academia, academia-academia collaborations at national & international level.
- 2.4. To provide support in conduction of Refresher Courses, Orientation courses, Research methodology programs and faculty development program.
- 2.5. Promotion of Research Activities in common interest area.
- 2.6. Privileged invitation for event(s) / program(s) organized by RFR Foundation and Bharatiya Shikshan Mandal (limited number of guests).
- 2.7. Display and information about facilities and opportunities at CUHPin the reception gallery at foundation.
- 2.8. Two nominations (incumbent authorities) in Samanvay Sabha for associates.
- 2.9. Support in execution, monitoring and evaluation process of various research activities.
- 2.10. Access and usage of knowledge resource centre, infrastructural facilities such as convention centre at special 'Academic Associates' discounted charges.
- 2.11. The facilities for students and faculties at concessional charges.

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- 2.12. Consultation, unbiased evolution of various educational processes as RFR FoundationAcademic &Administrative Audit program.
- 2.13. Information and invitation for research events conducted by other associate members for associates' network.

# ARTICLE 3: CO-ORDINATION AND NODAL OFFICER

Both entities shall mutually decide and designate a nodal officer. The nodal officer will have responsibility for fulfilling the objectives of this agreement and also will carry out all activities mutually agreed by the parties.

Neither of the Parties shall assign any of their duties under this MOU to any other person or institution without prior approval of other party. A specific agreement will be entered into for each activity.

# 6.3 Amendments

No alterations, additions or modification hereto shall be valid and binding unless the same are reduced to writing and signed by both the Parties.

# 6.4 Non-Exclusive Discussions

The Parties acknowledge and agree that the Areas of Collaboration under this MOU are being undertaken on a non-exclusive basis and either Party shall be free to enter into or consummate transactions similar to the Areas of Collaboration with other parties in Bharat or elsewhere.

# 6.5 Confidentiality and Public Announcement:

- 6.5.1. "Confidential Information" means the confidential, proprietary, and trade secret information of the disclosing party to be disclosed by the disclosing party under this MOU, and comprises (a) information in tangible form that:

  (a) (1) bears a Confidentiality Legend, or (2) does not bear any Confidentiality Legend, if the receiving party knew, or reasonably should have known under the circumstances, that the information was confidential and had been communicated to it in confidence, and (b) discussions about that information that may occur before, at the same time, or after disclosure of the information. This MOU and all confidential information exchanged between the Parties pursuant to this MOU shall be held in confidence.
- 6.5.2.Neither Party nor any of the affiliates shall make any public announcement about the MOU and /or the scope of proposed engagement, without the prior written consent of the other Party. Any public announcement so made, shall be as outlined in the Article 2 of this MOU.

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# 6.6 License and Intellectual Property Rights

- 6.6.1.No license is granted under this MOU to either Party under any of the other Party's intellectual property rights, either expressly, by implication, inducement, estoppel or otherwise. Both Parties understand and acknowledge that grant of any such license shall always be express and in writing.
- 6.6.2.Both parties will take all necessary steps to protect the knowledge documents and intellectual Properties generated during the process or shared by the parties.

# 6.7. Conflict of Interest

Neither of the parties believes that the Collaboration contemplated by this MOU raise any actual or potential conflicts of interest. The parties agree that this MOU and the negotiation of the same (and any other agreements entered into in connection herewith) are independent of any past, present or potential future arrangements, and are not connected to an existing business relationship between either of the parties.

# ARTICLE 7: TERMINATION

**7.1** This MOU shall also terminate without liability to either party if otherwise agreed to by the Parties in writing with a notice period of 1 month.

# 7.2 Survival and binding Nature

- 7.2.1. Except for Clause 6 (Terms), Cause 7 (Termination) and 8 (Dispute Settlement) of this MOU, nothing contained in this MOU is intended to be or shall be construed in any way to be legally binding on any of the Parties.
- 7.2.2. Except as set forth elsewhere in this MOU, Clause 6 (Terms), Cause 7 (Termination), 8 (Dispute Settlement) shall survive the expiry or termination of this MOU.

# 8.1 Governing Law and Jurisdiction

# Seminar Report

A National Seminar on the theme Memories, Narratives and Soundscape: Forgotten Themes of Indian National Movement (स्मृतियाँ, वृतांत तथा ध्वनिदृश्यः भारतीय राष्ट्र आंदोलन के विस्मृत विषय) was organized by and at Shodh Sansthan Neri, Hamirpur, Himachal Pradesh on 4th and 5th December 2021. The Departments of History of the Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Dharamshala and Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla were the co-organizers of the seminar. Participants, which included the resource persons, paper presenters and other scholars and enthusiasts of history, came from varied parts of the country, prominently from Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh. A total of 160 participants registered for the program and 55 scholars presented their research papers in six technical sessions spanning over two days. The Indian Council for Historical Research (ICHR), New Delhi financially sponsored the seminar and two observers form ICHR, namely, Dr Vinod Kumar and Dr Nitin Kumar also graced the occasion.

The chief guest of the inaugural program of the seminar was Shri Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar, Hon'ble Governor of Himachal Pradesh and the session was presided over by Professor Vasant Shinde, Former Vice Chancellor, Deccan College and Research Institute, Deemed University, Pune. Professor Kuldeep Chand Agnihotri, Advisor, Minister of Culture, Government of India and former Vice Chancellor, Central University of Himachal Pradesh, delivered the keynote address. Dr Kanwar Chanderdeep Singh, convenor of the national seminar, introduced the theme to the guests and the audience. In his deliverance, Prof. Agnihotri delved upon the key issues pertaining to the writing of modern Bhartiya history especially of the national movement. According to him, there were different streams along with the Indian National Congress who contributed immensely in their own capacity to unleash the anti British resistance. Prof Vasant Shinde delivered the presidential address in the virtual mode as due to ill health he was unable to come to the venue physically. While speaking on the occasion, hon'ble Governor congratulated the seminar organizers for highlighting the contribution of the unsung heroes, by the way of this academic program and he reminisced about the Goan freedom struggle, which was equally important but has been less talked about. Hon'ble Governor on the occasion released the Samarika (souvenir of the seminar) containing the abstracts of the research papers submitted by the scholars. Two other books namely, Swaraj Sangharsh mein Hmachal ke Nepathya Nayak edited by Dr Shiv Bhardwaj and Itihas Lekhan mein Lokgathaon ka Yogdan by Dr Om Prakash Sharma were also released on the occasion by the hon'ble Governor and other dignitaries.

There were four technical sessions on the first day of the seminar on 4th December 2021. Prof Narayan Singh Rao chaired the first technical session and Prof O.P. Sharma was the co-chair. There were thirteen research papers presented in the session on varied sub-themes of national and regional history. The second technical session was

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chaired and co-chaired by Prof. Arun Kumar Singh and Prof. Bhag Chand Chauhan respectively. Twelve research papers were read during this session.

The third technical session was held after the tea break. It was chaired by Dr Kanwar Chanderdeep Singh and co-chaired by Dr Rajeev Kumar. The researchers presented twelve research papers in this session. Dr Surendra G Soni chaired the fourth technical session on the first day and Dr Ankush Bhardwaj was the co-chairman of the session.

The second day of seminar saw two technical sessions. Dr Priyatosh Sharma chaired the first technical session of the day two. Dr Ashish Kumar chaired the second technical session of the day. A total of fourteen papers were presented by the scholars in these two sessions.

Every session witnessed some very good papers dealing with newer facets of the freedom movement not only from the national perspective but from the regional aspect as well. For instance, the research paper of Rajendra Sharma on the contribution of tribal region of Himachal Pradesh in the national movement was well received by the chairman and audience of the session. Similarly Banita Rani, a PhD research scholar from the Central University of Himachal Pradesh presented her paper on *Mata Durga Arya*, a prominent women patriot from Himachal Pradesh but scantily known in the national mainstream history. There were several other presentations, which dealt with the understanding of national movement with the aid of folk songs, folk tales, memories and folk history. The effort was to create a meta-narrative of the national movement from the micro studies based on primary researches in those geographical and social spaces that hitherto have been neglected or overlooked. At the conclusion of every session, there were deliberations on the research papers presented during the course including the question and answers, with expert comments from the chairman and cochairman of the sessions.

The seminar concluded with the valedictory program that began at 12 noon on 5th December 2021. The chief guest of the program was Prof. Prem Kumar Dhumal, former Chief Minister, Himachal Pradesh. The session was presided over by Prof. Kumar Ratnam, Member Secretary, ICHR, New Delhi. The guests of honour were Shri Virendra Kanwar and Shri Rakesh Pathania, honourable cabinet ministers, Government of Himachal Pradesh. Dr Chetram Garg, Director, Shodh Sansthan Neri, formally welcomed the guests and familiarized the audience with activities and achievements of the Sansthan. Speaking on the occasion Prof. Ratnam apprised the gathering about the direction that history writing should take and the important role that ICHR is playing in funding such groundbreaking researches in history. Prof. Dhumal while paying his tributes to the great visionary of history writing, Thakur Ram Singh, said that it was the high time that we should adopt Bhartiya methods to understand Bharat. The dignitaries released three books in the valedictory function. These were three were three decided and many and Mangal Das Dogra, Arhat Kaushik Bakula and Delimitation of Garage and Ga

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Kashmir by Sumer Khajuria and Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Vichar Darshan by Prof. Arun Kumar. AND WHEREAS the First and Second Party are a statutory humanitarian organization established in 1920 by the Parliament under Indian Red Cross Society Act, XV of 1920. It is the largest statutory humanitarian organization with a network of 36 states/UT branches and more than 1100 branches at District & Sub-district.

AND WHEREAS the First and Second Party work to provide Aid to the sick and wounded members of the Armed forces of the Union in accordance with the terms and spirit of the Geneva Conventions of the 12<sup>th</sup> August, 1949 and discharged of other obligations developing upon the Society under the conventions as the recognized auxiliary of the Armed Forces Medical services, Aid to demobilised sick and wounded members of the Armed Forces of the Union, Nursing and Ambulance work, relief for the mitigation of the suffering caused by epidemics, earthquakes, famines, floods and other disasters, whether in India or outside, the improvement of health, prevention of disease and mitigation of suffering and such other cognate objects as may be approved by the society from time to time.

AND WHEREAS the Third Party is an Institution of national importance setup by the Indian Government with its campuses at Dharamshala, Shahpur and Dehra, Kangra, District Himachal Pradesh. It is one of the fifteen Universities setup by Central University Act, 2009. The University currently has 12 schools and 32 department/centres. It has 07 undergraduate courses, 24 post graduate courses and 29 Doctoral courses.

AND WHEREAS the Third party has grown steadily and surely towards its vision to become renowned by catering to the needs of the society, both regionally and nationally.

AND WHEREAS the first and second party have agreed to collaborate with the Third party on the terms and conditions as noted hereinafter:

# NOW THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSES AS UNDER:

- The term of collaboration between the First Party and Second Party on the one hand and the Third Party on the other shall be for a period of three year from the date of execution of this MOU.
- 2. That all three parties will work within the mandates of each organization and adhere to the broad principles of humanitarian action as followed by the Red Cross Movement worldwide, namely, Humanitarianism, Impartially, Neutrality, Independence . Voluntarism, Unity and Universality.

3. That the collaboration will be with the following broad objectives:

a. Building the resilience of communities to disaster and climate change.

 Strong emphasis on disaster risk management on natural, manmade hazards and related environmental, technological and health hazards and risk.

c. Preventing new risk, reducing existing risk and strengthening resilience.

- 4. That the focused areas of collaboration will be following:
  - i. Disaster risk reduction, mitigation and preparedness.
  - ii. Water sanitation and hygiene promotion (WASH).

iii. Climate change adaption.

- iv. Environmental management and restoration.
- v. Ecosystem based livelihood support.
- vi. Health and blood services.
- vii. Any other area of mutual interest
- 5. That all these parties will draw upon the strengths of each other which in case of the Indian Red Cross Society are its large volunteer base and first Medical responders and the expertise of implementation of community directed programmes on the areas of interest. For CUHP, it is the large multi-sectoral technical expertise, faculty with the capacity to evaluate components of the project being implemented by the Indian Red Cross Society as well as training programmes and projects undertaken by it that include community intervention components in the areas of humanitarian interest.
- 6. The Parties shall constitute a joint committee having representation of Third party equal to the combined representation of First and Second party, for administering the collaboration. The said committee shall work under the Chairmanship of the officer nominated by the Secretary General, Indian Red Cross Society and Co-Chairman nominated by the Vice-chancellor, CUHP. The committee shall inter-alia be entrusted with the task of preparing and designing the collaborative projects annually or on need basis, general administration, allocation of resources needed, if any including financial and other connected matters and any other matter for the smooth conduct of the collaboration.
- 7. The Term of the annual project will be as per calendar year and will commence from each year.
- The details of the programmes/projects for 2020 and 2021will be worked-out and agreed upon immediately after the signing of the MOU and will be based on mutual consent among the parties.
- 9. Any dispute in the conduct of the programme will be mutually discussed and decided by the Chairman and Co-Chairman of the committee set up and if necessary, by the Secretary General, IRCS and the Vice-Chancellor, CUHP, However, decisions relating to projects where the funding is from single organization/sourced by one organization will be decided by the head of that organization who in case of the, Indian Red Cross Society will be the Secretary General, IRCS and in case of CUHP will be the Vice-Chancellor, CUHP and whose decision shall be final and binding on the Parties /Joint Committee.



- 10. Either of the parties can exit from the collaboration by giving a written notice of three months, however, efforts will be made to complete any ongoing projects, under this MOU.

### Introduction

The Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Government of India has launched the National Clean Air Programme (NCAP) for pan India to tackle the air pollution problem across the country. NCAP is envisaged as a collaborative cross sectoral and multi-stakeholder programme to tackle all sources of air pollution.

For the Kaia Amb town, the National Knowledge Network of NCAP has chosen HPCU Dharmshala as the foR to function as a technical partner and provide technical assistance to the GRAM PANCHYAT and SPCB

The collaboration will be established within the principles set out in the following sections

1. Objective

Under the NCAP, city specific interventions and action plans will be formulated for implementation by the *HPSPCB* and Gram panchyat, along with *Contral University of Immachai Pradesh*. Dharmshala as a technical partner for the village of *Kala Amb*. 2. Functions of the Parties

Role of IoR: IoR will act as a technical partner for the Kala Amb for the implementation of NCAP IoR will extend all necessary knowledge based support to the SPCB and GRAM PANCHYAT, in agreement with the guidance provided by CPCB and NKN. IoR may undertake Air quality monitoring and modelling work, data analysis, data utilization, compilation, adherence to interpretation protocols, report preparation, etc. IoR shall also help in calibration of CAAQMS, compliance verification work of emission norms as a third party to provide independent input to SPCBs/and policy makers. IoR shall be engaged by MoEF&CC for performance assessment (Third Party Audit (TPA)) based on predefined framework for cities other than with whom they are knowledge partners. Research conducted by IoR shall also focus on efficacy and efficiency of various individual measures by various tools and techniques including cost-benefit analysis with support from NKN.

Role of SPCB: SPCB will function as the regulatory body, overseeing the compliance of regulations and intervention policies in the city. SPCB will commit to their city specific action plans and inform IoR of their activities under NCAP, and consult IoR for technical expertise. SPCB will engage IoR in Capacity building with the help of NKN and ensure knowledge uniformity in planning and implementation of NCAP in all Non-Attainment cities in the State. SPCB as well as GRAM PANCHYAT will also ensure the use of best practices.

Role of Urban development: The GRAM PANCHYAT shall commit to all air quality targets mentioned for the city under NCAP. City specific interventions and action plans will be formulated by the GRAM PANCHYAT with advice from IoR. GRAM PANCHYAT shall update IoR on all progress made so far and consult them on all future activities undertaken as a part of NCAP.

# 3. Conflict of Interest

Since, the current pool of expertise in air quality domain is limited, it is desirable to include institutions/scientist/faculty members with a proven record in this domain as loRs, even if they are a part of the NKN. A faculty/scientist affiliated to an IoR will no: be involved in the decision making for the activities carried out by the IoR. That is whenever an NKN Nodal Faculty is approached to provide their consulting services as a nodal faculty/Principal Investigator (P.L.) of their affiliated IoR, they will recuse themselves from the agenda and the proposal will be reviewed by Nodal Faculty experts of any other NKN institute, and not by themselves

# 4. Method of Cooperation/Coordination

Whereas the parties to this MoU agree to co-operate in specific assignment(s), they shall share relevant information and experience in their possession with a view to achieve the mutually beneficial and technical association and to satisfy the need of the accomplishment of objective of MoU; except information which may be subject of copyright or technology agreements, royalties in licenses in which case the parties may procure the use of such information on commercial terms. Besides this, all the parties would also share the journals, publications, papers etc., published or any data, monitoring report etc. so that, capacity building of all parties/organization takes place to accomplish the objective. All parties shall appoint one member each to coordinate the activities on its behalf.

The expenditure incurred for implementation of the MoU for IoR, GRAM PANCHYAT and SPCB would be met out of NCAP/ Fifteenth Finance Commission funds / any other central or state scheme under implementation for improvement of Air quality available with GRAM PANCHYAT and SPCB SPCB is not getting any Grant-in-Aid except NCAP & such expenditure shall be met out of state scheme for which funds shall be provided by Rural development department

9. In case, there be a dispute relating to any aspect of academic cooperation, all the Parties will resolve the dispute in a spirit of mutual respect, and shared responsibility. failing which, the unresolved difference or disputes shall be referred to the arbitration by a distinguished authority agreed mutually by all the parties and decision by that authority shall be final and binding.

# 10. Force Majeure

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# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU) BETWEEN ARYABHATTA RESEARCH INSTITUTE OF OBSERVATIONAL SCIENCE (ARIES), NAINITAL AND CENTRAL UNIVERSITY OF HIMACHAL PRADESH, DHARAMSALA

This Memorandum of Understanding hereinafter referred to as MoU is signed on this 25th day of June in the year 2021 between the Aryabhatta Research Institute Of Observational Science (ARIES), Nainital, hereinafter called "ARIES" which expression, unless otherwise provided, shall include its successors and assignees, on the one part and the Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Dharamshala, District Kangra (Himachal Pradesh)-176215, hereinafter called "CUHP" which expression, unless otherwise provided, shall include its successor of assignees on the other part.

# 1. Preamble:

1.1 Whereas the Central Council for Indian Medicines and the University Grants Commission (UGC) have realized the need for a close linkage between National Laboratories and Universities in terms of research and academic activities. In compliance to this idea, the Aryabhatta Research Institute Of Observational Science (Aries), Nainital, and the Central University of Himachal Pradesh (CUHP), established under the Central Universities Act 2009, have expressed a desire to join hands for the cause of promotion of quality research and high end science and decided to sign Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to initiate academic and research programmes between the two Institutions in the broad areas of Physics, Astrophysics, Astronomy, Astronomical instrumentations and Atmospheric Sciences as per the following terms and conditions:

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# 2. Recitals

- 2.1 AND WHEREAS both the ARIES and the CUHP recognize that they share common goals and are desirous to establish a cooperative arrangement towards strengthening Indian higher education and research through mutual resource sharing.
- 2.2 AND WHEREAS both organizations are desirous to associate in all other related areas as may be agreed upon for furtherance of knowledge based enterprises, apt technical and management skill for future technology development, exchanging of information and work towards effective Research Institutions-Academia partnerships for Human Resource Development and R&D.
- 2.3 NOW THE PARTIES (ARIES and CUHP) HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGE AND agree to collaborate on collaborative and joint research work in the various areas of mutual interest by entering into this MoU covering the activities as detailed below:

## 3. Period of MoU and its Extension

- 3.1 This MoU comes into effect from the date of its signing and will remain in force till the completion of five (05) years. Its validity can be extended by mutual agreement between both the parties.
- 3.2 This MoU supersedes all the previous correspondences and discussions, undertakings and agreement between the two parties on the subject pertaining to this MoU.

# 4. Scope of MoU

4.1 The scope of the MoU will be to collaborate for research and teaching in the designated subjects related to Physics, Astrophysics, Astronomy, Astronomical instrumentations and Atmospheric Sciences. Both the Parties here wish to record the

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following main areas of cooperation on mutually agreed terms and conditions.

- 4.1.1 Mutual sharing of infrastructural facilities for pursuing research and conducting R&D programmes.
- 4.1.2 Knowledge sharing in the field of subjects related to Physics, Astrophysics, Astronomy, Astronomical instrumentations and Atmospheric Sciences.
- 4.1.3 Exchange of faculty/Research Degree scholar in regular courses and training programmes from both the institutions. For the mutual benefit of the two Institutions, there will be an exchange of faculty members/Research Degree scholars of the concerned school of CUHP.
- 4.1.4 Collaborative and Joint research projects by the ARIES scientists/FACULTY and faculty members of the concerned schools of CUHP through mutual sharing of the research facilities at ARIES and CUHP.
- 4.1.5 ARIES and CUHP will work closely to generate appropriately trained manpower in the mutually identified areas of Science & Technology through organization of formal academic curricula, symposia, short-term training courses, etc. TA/DA for scientists and research scholars will be borne by the respective organizations.
- 4.1.6 Faculty/ P.G./Ph.D. Scholars of one institution may work in the other institution for a short period in connection with their research work. They shall be considered on duty with the parent organisation for that period. TA/DA for scientists

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and research scholars will be borne by the respective organizations.

4.1.7 Faculties of one institution will be encouraged to deliver expert lectures/ invited talks at other institutions. In such cases TA/DA will be borne by the host institute. These visits/ training would be performed with the approval of competent authority.

# 4.2 Responsibility of CUHP

- 4.2.1 CUHP will recognize ARIES as an accredited Centre for supervising and guiding and pursuing research, leading to MPhil/PhD degree in the designated subjects related to Physics, Astrophysics, Astronomy, Astronomical instrumentations and Atmospheric Sciences.
- 4.2.2 CUHP will recognize ARIES Scientists/Faculty, subject to the fulfilment of eligibility requirements as per the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the University, as supervisors for guiding research leading to MPhil/PhD degrees.
- 4.2.3 CUHP will, subject to the fulfilment of eligibility requirements as per the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the University, confer the status of Adjunct Professor, Adjunct Associate Professor and Adjunct Assistant Professor on ARIES scientists/Faculty depending upon their qualifications and designations, involved in collaborative research and teaching with CUHP.
- 4.2.4 CUHP shall provide access to Library and research facilities to the Scientists/Faculty and PhD students of ARIES and that they shall be governed by the rules and regulations of

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the University as applicable to the faculty and research scholars of the University.

# 4.3 Responsibility of ARIES

- 4.3.1 ARIES shall provide access to its Library and research facilities to the students and faculty members of concerned schools of the CUHP and that they shall be governed by the rules and regulations as applicable to the ARIES Scientists/Faculty.
- 4.3.2 ARIES will provide summer training, research facilities to students (not more than 10 at a time) and ARIES Scientists/Faculty will help in the preparation of teaching material for these students.
- 4.3.3 ARIES shall arrange Hostel/Guest House accommodation for Central University of Himachal Pradesh students coming for summer trainings subject to availability of accommodation and in accordance to the guidelines for accommodation charges by ARIES
- 4.3.4 ARIES Scientists/Faculty recognised by the CUHP as Adjunct Professor, Adjunct Associate Professor and Adjunct Assistant Professor will be permitted to be involved in teaching and evaluation of students' performance in theory as well as practical classes in the CUHP.

# 4.4 Collaborative Research Degree (MPhil/PhD) Programme

4.4.1 ARIES and the CUHP shall, subject to their rules and regulations and through mutual consultation, evolve a collaborative Research Degree (MPhil/PhD) programme.

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- 4.4.2 Modalities of the collaborative research degree programme shall be worked out by the two organisations through mutual consultations and with due regard to the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the CUHP and the rules and regulations governing the ARIES.
- 4.4.3 The student shall be required to submit 'No Dues Certificate' from the Co-guide from ARIES before submission of thesis.
- 4.4.4 The student shall submit a copy of his/her thesis to the ARIES Library.

# 5. Areas of Collaborative Research

5.1 Areas of collaborative research shall be worked out mutually between the two parties keeping in view the research needs and priorities of the two parties and also depending upon the research expertise and research facilities available in the ARIES and the CUHP.

# 6. Co-ordination & Progress Review Committee (CPRC)

- 6.1 It is agreed that the progress of this MOU shall be monitored by a Review Committee comprising the Vice-Chancellor of the CUHP and the Director ARIES through periodic meetings.
- 6.2 Director of the ARIES and Dean of the School concerned from CUHP would be the coordinators for activities under this Moll.

# 7. Financial Terms

7.1 There shall be no financial obligations on the part of the ARIES and CUHP. Expenditures related to sample preparation, and

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experimentation would be borne by respective labs at their own end.

# 8. No Liability Clause

- 8.1 ARIES shall not be responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever, resulting due to implementation of any technology at the premises of CUHP or ARIES or due to testing of the same at the premises of CUHP or ARIES
- 8.2 CUHP shall not be responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever, resulting due to implementation of any technology at the premises of CUHP or ARIES, or due to testing of the same at the premises of CUHP or ARIES

# 9. Confidentiality Clause

- 9.1 Both the parties acknowledge the confidentiality of the information, which may be transferred between the parties or obtained or developed during the course of this exchange from time to time as being essential to this MoU and agree not to disclose the same to any third party. However, each party shall be free to disclose this information as is:
  - 9.1.1 In the public domain at the time of disclosure.
  - 9.1.2 Required to be disclosed by official authorities in accordance with applicable law or regulation.
- 9.2 While the parties agree to co-operate and otherwise act in good faith with the view to the successful implementation, there is no financial binding on either party. This MoU is intended to mutual understanding of the parties hereto as at the date thereof.

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- 9.3 Any notice, request or other communication required or permitted to be given under this MoU shall be in writing and shall be delivered in person or by recognized courier service or facsimile, or to the authorized persons of two organisations to be notified separately.
- 9.4 Each of the parties recognizes that the successful implementation of this MOU to the mutual satisfaction and benefit of both the parties will require a significant degree of cooperation and good faith on behalf of both the parties. Each of the parties resolves to act in good faith and in accordance with the spirit of this MOU to implement the provisions in accordance with the mutual desire and in the interests of the parties.
- 9.5 Both the parties undertake not to transfer, for any consideration to be received by it, the know-how/data obtained through this MoU to any other party in any manner whatsoever without prior written approval of each other whether within and beyond the period of this MoU. Both the parties shall take all necessary measures to ensure that the knowledge/data obtained under this MoU is not passed on or disclosed to any third party.
- 9.6 While the parties agree to co-operate and otherwise act in good faith with the view for successful implementation, there is no financial binding on either party. This MoU is intended to mutual understanding of the parties hereto as at the date thereof.

# 10. Publications

10.1 Publications, if any, in respect of the development of the know-how as envisaged with the prior mutual consent of the two parties shall be in the names of the investigators. Prior

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publications will be avoided where a patent or patents may possibly be taken.

- 10.2 Publications, if any, in respect of the said studies will be with the prior mutual consent of ARIES and CUHP and shall be in the names of both the parties suitability acknowledged by ARIES /CUHP.
- 10.3 Prior publications will be avoided where a patent or patents may possibly be taken.

# 11. Protection & Disposition of Ownership of Intellectual Property Rights

- 11.1 The ownership of all Background Information and Background Intellectual Property Rights generated by the parties prior to the MoU shall rest with the respective parties. However, parties shall have the right to use such Background Information and Background Intellectual Property Rights for the purposes of the R&D work performed under the MoU.
- 11.2 All Foreground Information and Foreground Intellectual Property Rights created during the R&D work performed under the MoU shall be owned jointly by the parties.
- 11.3 Parties to this MoU shall confer and consult each other regarding filing of Intellectual Property Rights applications including patent applications covering Foreground Information and share equally the attendant expenditure related to filing, prosecution, grant, maintenance etc. of the same.

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11.4 In the event of any extraordinary situation including infringement suits filed by third parties, parties shall initiate any action in mutual consultation and agreement.

# 12. Patent & Patent Infringement

- 12.1 If the know-how developed as a result of a study undertaken under this MoU leads to a patent or patents being taken, the parties hereto shall mutually agree whether or not to apply for a patent/s and if so in which country. Patents taken, if any, will be in joint names of the two parties. The cost of taking out a patent shall be borne by ARIES or CUHP.
- 12.2 In the event of any claim or action being brought against either party to this MoU alleging infringement of a patent of a third party, the parties hereto shall mutually decide whether to defend the claim or not. The cost of defence against any such claims or action shall be borne by the two parties hereto.
- 12.3 In the event of patents being filed, out of the research work of a student working at ARIES for MPhil/PhD thesis under the sole supervision of scientist(s) from the ARIES, the CUHP shall have no claim to IPRs.
- 12.4 In the event of patents being filed, out of the research work of a student working at CUHP for MPhil/PhD thesis under the sole supervision of faculty member(s) of the CUHP, the ARIES shall have no claim to IPRs.
- 12.5 In the event of a patent being filed, out of the research work of a student working at ARIES for MPhil/PhD thesis under the joint supervision of the scientist(s) and faculty member(s) of the CUHP,

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the cost of patenting and any monetary benefits accruing subsequent of filing and maintaining the patents will be shared by ARIES and CUHP on equal basis.

12.6 In the event of a patent being filed out of the collaborative research work between the faculty members of CUHP and the scientists of ARIES the cost of patenting and monetary benefits accruing subsequent to filing and maintaining of the patents will be shared by CUHP and ARIES on equal basis.

# 13. MoU and its Amendments

13.1 This MoU shall be the principal repository of the terms and conditions agreed to between the parties and no amendment thereof shall take effect or be binding on both the parties unless such amendment is authorized by them and is recorded in writing and signed by the duly authorized representatives of both the parties.

# 14. Termination

- 14.1 In case it is found by the two parties that the desired objectives cannot be achieved due to any reason(s) whatsoever, this MoU will be treated as terminated by a mutually agreed procedure without any liability on either of the parties.
- 14.2 However the MPhil and PhD students admitted under the collaborative research supervision shall continue to be governed by the same terms and conditions till the completion of their degrees in accordance with the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the CUHP and the rules and regulations governing the ARIES.

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# 15. Force Majeure

15.1 Neither party shall be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligation under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the force majeure events, such as, but not limited to Acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquakes, Strike(s), Lockout(s), Epidemics, Riots, Civil commotion etc provided on occurrence and cessation of such events, the party affected by these shall give a notice in writing to the other party within one month of such occurrence and cessation. If the majeure conditions continue beyond six months, the parties shall then mutually decide about the future course of action.

# 16. Arbitration

- 16.1 Except as otherwise provided elsewhere in the MoU, in the event of any dispute or difference relating to, arising from or connected with the MoU such dispute or difference shall be resolved between the parties by mutual consultation and to the satisfaction of both the parties.
- 16.2 If amicable settlement cannot be reached within 30 days from the date of the occurrence of the dispute, the matter under dispute shall be finally settled without recourse to the courts, in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and amendments thereto, if any.
- 16.3 The Arbitration shall be conducted by the Arbitrator(s) appointed by the mutual consent of both the parties in accordance with the Rules of the said Act. The arbitral award shall be final and binding. The arbitration proceedings shall be held at Dharamshala.

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# 17. Hold Harmless

- 17.1 The ARIES agrees to hold CUHP harmless from any claim or damages arising from the ARIES's performance of work under this contract ARIES shall also hold CUHP harmless without any limitation from any claims or damages raised or damages suffered by the ARIES.
- 17.2 The CUHP agrees to hold ARIES harmless from any claim or damages arising from the CUHP's performance of work under this contract. CUHP shall also hold ARIES harmless without any limitation from any claims or damages raised or damages suffered by the CUHP.

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# Optical flux and colour variability of blazars in the ZTF survey

### **ABSTRACT**

We investigate the temporal and colour variability of 897 blazars, comprising 455 BL Lacertae objects (BL Lacs) and 442 Flat Spectrum Radio Quasars (FSRQs), selected from the Roma-BZCAT catalogue, using the multiband light curves from the Zwicky Transient Facility (ZTF DR6) survey. Assessing the colour variability characteristics over ~2 yr time-scales, we found that 18.5 per cent (84 out of 455) BL Lacs showed a stronger bluer-when-brighter (BWB) trend, whereas 9.0 per cent (41 out of 455) showed a redder-when-brighter (RWB) trend. The majority (70 per cent) of the BL Lacs showing RWB are host galaxy dominated. For the FSRQ subclass, 10.2 per cent (45 out of 442) objects showed a strong BWB trend and 17.6 per cent (78 out of 442) showed a strong RWB trend. Hence, we find that BL Lacs more commonly follow a BWB trend than do FSRQs. This can be attributed to the more dominant jet emission in the case of BL Lacs and the contribution of thermal emission from the accretion disc for FSROs. In analysing the colour behaviour on shorter time windows, we find many blazars evince shorter partial trends of BWB or RWB nature (or occasionally both). Some of such complex colour behaviours observed in the colour-magnitude diagrams of the blazars may result from transitions between the jet-dominated state and the disc-dominated state and vice versa.

# 1 INTRODUCTION

Blazars are a special subclass of active galactic nuclei (AGNs), possessing a relativistic jet directed close to the observer's line of sight (Blandford & Rees 1978; Urry & Padovani 1995). The blazars emit in a very wide range of wavelengths from radio to gamma-ray bands and show violent variability on diverse timescales ranging from minutes to years (e.g. Hufnagel & Bregman 1992). Their spectral energy distributions (SEDs) are characterized by non-thermal continuum spectra consisting of two components: a low-energy component peaking anywhere from infrared to X-ray frequencies and a high-energy component peaking at frequencies from hard X-rays to TeV gamma-rays. The low-energy component is attributed to the synchrotron radiation emitted by relativistic electrons in the jets (Urry & Mushotzky 1982). While the origin of the high-energy component is not fully understood, it is commonly thought to be due to the inverse-Compton scattering of soft photons by the same relativistic electrons (e.g. Dermer, Schlickeiser & Mastichiadis 1992; Sikora, Begelman & Rees 1994).

Blazars are broadly classified into two categories: BL Lacertae objects (BL Lacs) and flat spectrum radio quasars (FSRQs) (Angel & Stockman 1980), based on the rest-frame equivalent widths (EWs) in their spectra being <5 Å and >5 Å, respectively (e.g. Ghisellini et al. 2011). BL Lacs are further classified into three subcategories depending on the peak frequency of their synchrotron emission: high-, intermediate-, and low-energy peaked BL Lac objects (HBL, IBL, and LBL). The peak frequencies for HBLs, IBLs, and LBLs lie higher than, around, and lower than the optical band, respectively.

The study of blazar variability is an important tool that provides valuable information about their nature. The optical variability of blazars has been a topic of intensive research since their discovery as it affords a unique perspective on accretion disc and jet physics (Wagner & Witzel 1995; Ghosh et al. 2000; Villata et al. 2004; Gupta et al. 2008; Rani et al. 2010; Gu & Ai 2011; Ikejiri et al. 2011; Bonning et al. 2012; Mao & Zhang 2016). In particular, optical brightness variations in blazars are often accompanied by spectral variations that can be revealed by the colour-magnitude (or spectral index-magnitude) correlations (e.g. Ciprini et al. 2003). The analysis of spectral variability is of special interest in the sense that it might constrain the origin of corresponding brightness variations, even when restricted to the optical band (Vagnetti, Trevese & Nesci 2003).

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# Accretion disc sizes from continuum reverberation mapping of AGN selected from the ZTF survey

### **ABSTRACT**

We present the accretion disc-size estimates for a sample of 19 active galactic nuclei (AGNs) using the optical g-, r-, and i-band light curves obtained from the Zwicky Transient Facility survey. All the AGNs have reliable supermassive black hole (SMBH) mass estimates based on previous reverberation mapping measurements. The multiband light curves are cross-correlated, and the reverberation lag is estimated using the Interpolated Cross-Correlation Function method and the Bayesian method using the JAVELIN code. As expected from the disc-reprocessing arguments, the g-r band lags are shorter than the g-i band lags for this sample. The interband lags for all, but five sources, are larger than the sizes predicted from the standard Shakura Sunyaev (SS) analytical model. We fit the light curves directly using a thin disc model implemented through the JAVELIN code to get the accretion disc sizes. The disc sizes obtained using this model are on an average 3.9 times larger than the prediction based on the SS disc model. We find a weak correlation between the disc sizes and the known physical parameters, namely the luminosity and the SMBH mass. In the near future, a large sample of AGNs covering broader ranges of luminosity and SMBH mass from large photometric surveys would be helpful in a better understanding of the structure and physics of the accretion disc.

# 1 INTRODUCTION

Accretion discs in active galactic nuclei (AGNs) form as a result of inflowing matter on to the central supermassive black hole (SMBH) (Salpeter 1964; Lynden-Bell 1969). Various accretion disc models have been proposed ranging from the standard Shakura Sunyaev (SS) disc (Shakura & Sunyaev 1973), the slim disc (Abramowicz et al. 1988) to more complicated models like the advection dominated accretion disc presented by Narayan & Yi (1995), and the relativistic accretion disc around a Kerr black hole presented by Li et al. (2005). Based on these models, the accretion disc has a temperature profile, with higher temperatures in the inner regions and decreasing temperatures in the outer regions. The growing observational shreds of evidence suggest that the X-ray emission in the innermost regions of the AGN accretion disc is reprocessed as the ultraviolet (UV)/optical continuum flux. Further, the rapid X-ray variability and relative strength of the hard X-ray component point towards the presence of a corona in the proximity of the SMBH, which irradiates the accretion disc. However, the exact size and structure of this corona are not known precisely (e.g. see Meyer-Hofmeister, Liu & Qiao 2017; Arcodia et al. 2019; Sun et al. 2020).

According to the standard SS disc model, the effective temperature T at a particular location in the accretion disc  $R_{\rm disc}$  is related to the disc size and the SMBH mass as follows:

$$T(R_{\rm disk}) = \left(\frac{3GM_{\rm BH}\dot{M}}{8\pi\sigma(R_{\rm disk})^3}\right)^{1/4},\tag{1}$$

where  $\sigma$  denotes the Stefan-Boltzmann constant and G and  $\dot{M}$ represent the gravitational constant and the mass accretion rate, respectively. As is evident from this equation, the accretion discsize (R) scales inversely with the temperature (T) by a power-law index of 4/3.

The photon wavelength  $(\lambda_0)$  at a particular disc radius is related to the temperature by Wein's law. The size of the accretion disc at the wavelength  $\lambda_0$  can be determined by two observable parameters, the SMBH mass and the mass accretion rate. The radiation from the accretion disc is assumed to be composed of multiple blackbodies, and the disc sizes at various wavelengths can be calculated using the equation below:

$$R_{\lambda} = R_{\lambda_0} \left[ \left( \frac{\lambda}{\lambda_0} \right)^{\beta} \right]. \tag{2}$$

Here,  $R_{\lambda_0}$  is the disc size at a reference wavelength  $\lambda_0$  and  $\beta$  is 4/3 = 1.33 for the standard SS disc. The temperature profile of the



To cooperate on any other activities that may be identified on a 5. consensual basis as and when such an opportunity arises.

This Memorandum of Understanding hereinafter referred to as MoU is signed on this .....2.1....day of October in the year 2021 between the REGIONAL CUM FACILITATION CENTRE NORTHERN REGION-1, JOGINDER NAGAR, Himachal Pradesh, hereinafter called "RCFC-NR-1" which expression, unless otherwise provided, shall include its successors and assignees, on the one part and the Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Dharamshala, District Kangra (Himachal Pradesh)-176215, hereinafter called "CUHP" which expression, unless otherwise provided, shall include its successor of assignees on the other part.

# 1. Preamble:

1.1 Whereas the Regional Cum Facilitation Centre Northern Region-land the University Grants Commission (UGC) have realized the need for a close linkage between National Laboratories and Universities in terms of research and academic activities. In compliance to this idea, the Regional Cum Facilitation Centre Northern Region-1 (RCFC-NR-1), Joginder Nagar and the Central University of Himachal Pradesh (CUHP), established under the Central Universities Act2009, have expressed a

desire to join hands for the cause of promotion of quality research and high end science and decided to sign Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to initiate academic and research programmes between the two Institutions in the broad areas of Biosciences and Bioinformatics as per the following terms and conditions:

# 2. Recitals

- 2.1 AND WHEREAS both the RCFC-NR-1 and the CUHP recognize that they share common goals and are desirous to establish, a cooperative arrangement towards strengthening Indian higher education and research through mutual resource sharing.
- 2.2 AND WHEREAS both organizations are desirous to associate in all other related areas as may be agreed upon for furtherance of knowledge based enterprises, apt technical and management skill for future technology development, exchanging of information and work towards effective Research Institutions-Academia partnerships for Human Resource Development and R&D.
- 2.3 NOW THE PARTIES (RCFC-NR-1 and CUHP) HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGE AND agree to collaborate on collaborative and joint research work in the various areas of mutual interest by entering into this MoU covering the activities as detailed below:

# 3. Period of MoU and its Extension

- 3.1 This MoU comes into effect from the date of its signing and will remain in force till the completion of five (05) years. Its validity can be extended by mutual agreement between both the parties.
- 3.2 This MoU supersedes all the previous correspondences and discussions, undertakings and agreement between the two parties on the subject pertaining to this MoU.

# 4. Scope of MoU

- 4.1 The scope of the MoU will be to collaborate for research and teaching in the designated subjects of Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Chemistry, and Molecular Biology, Plant Sciences, Animal Sciences or any other branch of Life Sciences or Chemical Sciences. Both the Parties hereto wish to record the following main areas of cooperation on mutually agreed terms and conditions.
  - 4.1.1 Mutually sharing of infrastructural facility for persuing research and conducting R&D programmes.
  - 4.1.2 Knowledge sharing in the field of Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Chemistry, and Molecular Biology, Plant Sciences, Animal Sciences or any other branch of Life Sciences or Chemical Sciences.
  - 4.1.3 Exchange of faculty in regular courses and training programme from both the institutions. For the mutual benefit of the two Institutions, there will be exchange of RCFC-NR-1 scientists and faculty members of the concerned school of CUHP.
  - 4.1.4 Collaborative and Joint research projects by the RCFC-NR-1 scientists and faculty members of the concerned schools of CUHP through mutual sharing of the research facilities at RCFC-NR-1 and CUHP.
  - 4.1.5 RCFC-NR-1 and CUHP will work closely to generate appropriately trained manpower in the mutually identified areas of Science & Technology through organization of formal academic curricula, symposia, short-term training courses, etc. TA/DA for scientists and research scholars will be borne by the respective organizations.

# 4.2 Responsibility of CUHP

4.2.1 CUHP will recognize RCFC-NR-1 as an accredited Centre for supervising and guiding and pursuing research, leading to MPhil/PhD degree in the designated subjects of Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Chemistry, Molecular Biology, Plant Sciences, Animal Sciences or any other branch of Life Sciences or Chemical Sciences.

- 4.2.2 CUHP will recognize RCFC-NR-1 scientists, subject to the fulfilment of eligibility requirements as per the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the University, as co-supervisors for guiding research leading to MPhil/PhD degrees.
- 4.2.3 CUHP will, subject to the fulfilment of eligibility requirements as per the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the University, confer the status of Adjunct Professor, Adjunct Associate Professor and Adjunct Assistant Professor on RCFC-NR-1 scientists, depending upon their qualifications and designations, involved in collaborative research and teaching with CUHP.
- 4.2.4 CUHP shall provide access to Library and research facilities to the scientists and PhD students of RCFC-NR-1 and that they shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the University as applicable to the faculty and research scholars of the University.

# 4.3 Responsibility of RCFC-NR-1

- 4.3.1 RCFC-NR-1 shall provide access to its Library and research facilities to the students and faculty members of concerned schools of the CUHP and that they shall be governed by the rules and regulations as applicable to the RCFC-NR-1 Scientists.
- 4.3.2 RCFC-NR-1 will provide summer training, research facilities to students (not more than 10 at a time) and RCFC-NR-1 scientists will help in the preparation of teaching material for these students.
- 4.3.3 RCFC-NR-1 shall arrange Hostel/Guest House accommodation for Central University of Himachal Pradesh students coming for summer trainings subject to availability of accommodation and in accordance to the guidelines for accommodation charges by RCFC-NR-1.

4.3.4 RCFC-NR-1 Scientists recognised by the CUHP as Adjunct Professor, Adjunct Associate Professor and Adjunct Assistant Professor will be permitted to be involved in teaching and evaluation of students' performance in theory as well as practical classes in the CUHP.

# 4.4 Collaborative Research Degree (MPhil/PhD) Programme

- 4.4.1 RCFC-NR-1 and the CUHP shall, subject to their rules and regulations and through mutual consultation, evolve a collaborative Research Degree (MPhil/PhD) programme.
- 4.4.2 Modalities of the collaborative research degree programme shall be worked out by the two organisation through mutual consultations and with due regard to the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the CUHP and the rules and regulations governing the RCFC-NR-1.

# 5. Areas of Collaborative Research

Areas of collaborative research shall be worked out mutually between the two parties keeping in view the research needs and priorities of the two parties and also depending upon the research expertise and research facilities available in the RCFC-NR-1 and the CUHP.

# 6. Co-ordination & Progress Review Committee (CPRC)

- 6.1 It is agreed that the progress of this MOU shall be monitored by a Review Committee comprising Vice Chancellor of the CUHP and the Regional Director, RCFC-NR-1 through periodic meetings.
- 6.2 Director of the RCFC-NR-1 and Dean of the School concerned from CUHP would be the coordinators for activities under this MoU.

# 7. Financial Terms

7.1 There shall be no financial obligations on the part of the RCFC-NR-1 and CUHP. Expenditures related to sample preparation, and experimentation would be borne by respective labs at their own end.

# 8. No Liability Clause

- 8.1 RCFC-NR-1 shall not be responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever, resulting due to implementation of any technology at the premises of CUHP or RCFC-NR-1, or due to testing of the same at the premises of CUHP or RCFC-NR-1.
- 8.2 CUHP shall not be responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever, resulting due to implementation of any technology at the premises of CUHP or RCFC-NR-1, or due to testing of the same at the premises of CUHP or RCFC-NR-1.

# 9. Confidentiality Clause

- 9.1 Both the parties acknowledge the confidentiality of the information, which may be transferred between the parties or obtained or developed during the course of this exchange from time to time as being essential to this MoU and agree not to disclose the same to any third party. However, each party shall be free to disclose this information as is:
  - 9.1.1 In the public domain at the time of disclosure.
  - 9.1.2 Required to be disclosed by official authorities in accordance with applicable law or regulation.
- 9.2 While the parties agree to co-operate and otherwise act in good faith with the view to the successful implementation, there is no financial binding on either party. This MoU is intended to mutual understanding of the parities hereto as at the date thereof.
- 9.3 Any notice, request or other communication required or permitted to be given under this MoU shall be in writing and shall be delivered in person or by recognized courier service or facsimile, or to the authorized persons of two organisation to be notified separately.
- 9.4 Each of the parties recognizes that the successful implementation of this MOU to the mutual satisfaction and benefit of both the parties will require a significant degree of cooperation and good faith on behalf of both the parties. Each of the

parties resolves to act in good faith and in accordance with the spirit of this MOU to implement the provisions in accordance with the mutual desire and in the interests of the parties.

- 9.5 Both the parties undertake not to transfer, for any consideration to be received by it, the know-how/data obtained through this MoU to any other party in any manner whatsoever without prior written approval of each other whether within and beyond the period of this MoU. Both the parties shall take all necessary measures to ensure that the knowledge/data obtained under this MoU is not passed on or disclosed to any third party.
- 9.6 While the parties agree to co-operate and otherwise act in good faith with the view for successful implementation, there is no financial binding on either party. This MoU is intended to mutual understanding of the parities hereto as at the date thereof.

# 10. Publications

- 10.1 Publications, if any, in respect of the development of the know-how as envisaged with the prior mutual consent of the two parties shall be in the names of the investigators. Prior publications will be avoided where a patent or patents may possibly be taken.
- 10.2 Publications, if any in respect of the said studies will be with the prior mutual consent of RCFC-NR-1 and CUHP and shall be in the names of both the parties suitability acknowledged by RCFC-NR-1/CUHP.
- 10.3 Prior publications will be avoided where a patent or patents may possibly be taken.

# 11. Protection & Disposition of Ownership of Intellectual Property Rights

11.1 The ownership of all Background Information and Background Intellectual Property Rights generated by the parties prior to the MoU shall rest with the respective parties. However, parties shall have right to use such Background

Information and Background Intellectual Property Rights for the purposes of the R&D work performed under the MoU.

- 11.2 All Foreground Information and Foreground Intellectual Property Rights created during the R&D work performed under the MoU shall be owned jointly by the parties.
- 11.3 Parties to this MoU shall confer and consult each other regarding filing of Intellectual Property Rights applications including patent applications covering Foreground Information and share equally the attendant expenditure related to filing, prosecution, grant, maintenance etc. of the same.
- 11.4 In the event of any extraordinary situation including infringement suits filed by third parties, parties shall initiate any action in mutual consultation and agreement.

# 12. Patent & Patent Infringement

- 12.1 If the know-how developed as a result of a study undertaken under this MoU leads to a patent or patents being taken, the parties hereto shall mutually agree whether or not to apply for a patent/s and if so in which country. Patents taken, if any, will be in joint names of the two parties. The cost of taking out a patent shall be borne by RCFC-NR-1 or CUHP.
- 12.2 In the event of any claim or action being brought against either party to this MoU alleging infringement of a patent of a third party, the parties hereto shall mutually decide whether to defend the claim or not. The cost of defence against any such claims or action shall be borne by the two parties hereto.
- 12.3 In the event of patents being filed, out of the research work of a student working at RCFC-NR-1 for MPhil/PhD thesis under the sole supervision of scientist(s) from the NCFC-NR-1, the CUHP shall have no claim to IPRs.

- 12.4 In the event of patents being filed, out of the research work of a student working at CUHP for MPhil/PhD thesis under the sole supervision of faculty member(s) of the CUHP, the RCFC-NR-1 shall have no claim to IPRs.
- 12.5 In the event of a patent being filed, out of the research work of a student working at RCFC-NR-1 for MPhil/PhD thesis under the joint supervision of the scientist(s) and faculty member(s) of the CUHP, the cost of patenting and any monetary benefits accruing subsequent of filing and maintaining the patents will be shared by RCFC-NR-1 and CUHP on equal basis.
- 12.6 In the event of a patent being filed out of the collaborative research work between the faculty members of CUHP and the scientists of RCFC-NR-1 the cost of patenting and monetary benefits accruing subsequent to filing and maintaining of the patents will be shared by CUHP and RCFC-NR-1 on equal basis.

### 13. MoU and its Amendments

13.1 This MoU shall be the principal repository of the terms and conditions agreed to between the parties and no amendment thereof shall take effect or be binding on both the parties unless such amendment is authorized by them and is recorded in writing and signed by the duly authorized representatives of both the parties.

### 14. Termination

- In case it is found by the two parties that the desired objectives cannot be achieved due to any reason(s) whatsoever, this MoU will be treated as terminated by a mutually agreed procedure without any liability on either of the party.
- 14.2 However the MPhil and PhD students admitted under the collaborative research supervision shall continue to be governed by the same terms and conditions till the completion of their degrees in accordance with the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of the CUHP.

### 15. Force Majeure

15.1 Neither party shall be held responsible for non-fulfilment of their respective obligation under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the force majeure events, such as, but not limited to Acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquakes, IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Parties hereto have duly executed this MOU on day of Octoberyear Two Thousand and Twenty One.

### 1. Preamble:

#### 2. Recitals

- 2.3 NOW THE PARTIES (CORD and CUHP) HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGE AND agree to collaborate on collaborative and joint research work in the various areas of mutual interest by entering into this MoU covering the activities as detailed below:

### 3. Period of MoU and its Extension

- 3.1 This MoU comes into effect from the date of its signing and will remain in force till the completion of five (05) years. Its validity can be extended by mutual agreement between both the parties.
- 3.2 This MoU supersedes all the previous correspondences and discussions, undertakings and agreement between the two parties on the subject pertaining to this MoU.

### 4. Scope of MoU

- 4.1 The scope of the MoU will be to collaborate for research and extension activities carried out by the Institutions in the field of rural development. Both the Parties hereto wish to record the following main areas of cooperation on mutually agreed terms and conditions.

4.1.4 CORD and CUHP will work closely for up-liftment of rural society by mutually identified areas of Science & Technology through organization of formal extension programmes, symposia, short-term training courses, etc. TA/DA for faculty, students and officials will be borne by the respective organizations.

### 4.2 Responsibility of CUHP

- 4.2.1 CUHP will recognize CORD as an accredited Centre for pursuing researchand extension activities jointly.
- 4.2.2 CUHP shall provide access to Library and research facilities to the trainees and officials of CORD and that they shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the University as applicable to the faculty and research scholars of the University.

### 4.3 Responsibility of CORD

- 4.3.1 CORD shall provide access to its Library and infrastructure facilities to the students and faculty members of the CUHP and that they shall be governed by the rules and regulations as applicable to CORD.
- 4.3.2 CORD will provide summer training, research facilities to students and CORD officials will help in extension programmes for these students.
- 4.3.3 CORD shall arrange Hostel/Guest House accommodation for Central University of Himachal Pradesh students coming for summer trainings subject to availability of accommodation and in accordance to the guidelines for accommodation charges by CORDand with the condition that all will follow rules and regulations of CORD in the premises, field and any other institution/place when visiting them while in CORD for their work, learning's & research.

### 5. Areas of Collaborative Research

- 5.1 Areas of collaborative research shall be worked out mutually between the two parties keeping in view the research needs and priorities of the two parties and also depending upon the research expertise and research facilities available in the CORD and the CUHP.
- 5.2 Both parties will organize joint extension programmes and involve students of the CUHP.
- 5.3 Students of CUHP may be involved in the different activities carried out by the CORD.

## 6. Co-ordination & Progress Review Committee (CPRC)

- 6.1 It is agreed that the progress of this MOU shall be monitored by a Review Committee comprising Vice-Chancellor of the CUHP and the Chief Operating Officer, representing the National Director of CORD through periodic meetings.
- 6.2 Chief Operating Officer of CORD and Dean of the School concerned from CUHP would be the coordinators for activities under this MoU.

### 7. Financial Terms

7.1 There shall be no financial obligations on the part of the CORD and CUHP. Expenditures related to sample preparation, and experimentation would be borne by respective labs at their own end.

### 8. No Liability Clause

- 8.1 CORD shall not be responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever, resulting due to implementation of any technology at the premises of CUHP or CORD, or due to testing of the same at the premises of CUHP or CORD.
- 8.2 CUHP& CORD shall not be responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever, resulting due to implementation of any technology at the premises of CUHP or CORD, or due to testing of the same at the premises of CUHP or CORD.
- 8.3 The candidate while in CORD will be responsible for their own health and well-being and costs involved. They will waiver CORD from any liabilities and legal issues concerning their health and well-being.
- When sharing the learning and experience acquired at CORD with someone else at the university, school or at any other platform or publishing it, CORD will need to acknowledge CORD and will have to send a copy of the literature to CORD. When publishing documents on CORD's learning experiences —one will have to take prior permission from CORD through email or in writing.

### 9. MoU and its Amendments

9.1 This MoU shall be the principal repository of the terms and conditions agreed to between the parties and no amendment thereof shall take effect or be binding on both the parties unless such amendment is authorized by them and is recorded in writing and signed by the duly authorized representatives of both the parties.

### 10. Termination

10.1 In case it is found by the two parties that the desired objectives cannot be achieved due to any reason(s) whatsoever, this MoU will be treated as terminated by a mutually agreed procedure without any liability on either of the party.

### 11. Hold Harmless

- 11.1 The CORD agrees to hold CUHP harmless from any claim or damages arising from the CORD's performance of work under this contract. CORD shall also hold CUHP harmless without any limitation from any claims or damages raised or damages suffered by the CORD.
- 11.2 The CUHP agrees to hold CORD harmless from any claim or damages arising from the CUHP's performance of work under this contract. CUHP shall also hold CORD harmless without any limitation from any claims or damages raised or damages suffered by the CUHP.

#### ARTICLE 1: BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

- 1.1.2. TheRFR Foundationhas functional dimensions to strengthen and synchronize Research, Researchers, Resources and Reach.
- 1.1.3. The RFR Foundation is a multi-domain Research Institute and a network hub of research and allied activities in academics and industrial sector.

#### AND

- 1.2.1. Central University of Himachal Pradesh (hereinafter referred as CUHP) is an University established by the Central Universities Act 2009 (No. 25 of 2009).
- 1.2.2. **CUHP**functions as per the provisions of the central University act and statute 2009 & Ordinances published by Central University of Himachal Pradesh.

#### 1.1 Vision and Mission:

CUHP strives for Inclusive Access to Excellence in Higher Education and Research to emerge as Premier University of the Country at par with the best Universities of the World in terms of Programme Offerings, Curricular, Framework, Pedagogy, Research, Publications and Integration with the World of Work.

Objectives are to disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities in such branches of learning as it may deem fit; to make special provisions for integrated courses in humanities, social sciences, sciences and technology in its educational programmes, to take appropriate measures for promoting innovations in teaching-learning process and inter-disciplinary studies and research; to educate and train manpower for the development of the country: to establish linkages with industries for the promotion of science and technology.

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### 1.2 Purpose:

Now therefore the parties hereto have agreed to enter into a memorandum of understanding considering the long term benefits of sharing the knowledge and resources between the institute and establish a strong academic collaboration, by undertaking joint responsibilities and activities in their respective field of excellence, research, resources, knowledge and human described in the article 2 of this MOU as area of collaboration.

### ARTICLE 2: AREAS OF COLLABORATION

  - 1.1.3. Philosophical acceptance and responsibility towards concept of 'Resurgence'.
  - 1.1.4. Monitoring, execution and evaluation of parameter/s ofresearch applicability for nation / society / localrequirement,incorporation of Bharatiya methodology and references in various programs at institutional level including Ph.D., M.Phil., Post-Graduation, Under Graduation research projects andresearch methodology program.

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- 1.1.5. Establishing platform for converting strength & excellence in terms of infrastructure and human resource for betterment of educational systems across world.
- 1.2. To organize national, international events, program at mutually agreed interval.
- 1.3. To provide infrastructure, academic & technical Support in various activities organized by RFR Foundation, subject to availability.
- 1.4. Promote and support student(s), faculty(s) exchange programs.
- 1.5. Maintain respect and dignity among other Academic associates and Industrial associates of RFR Foundation.
- 1.6. Active participation in associate members' annual meetings organized by RFR Foundation.
- 1.7. To recognize RFRF as workplace for research including PhD studies and post-doctoral research.

### 2. The responsibilities and work for RFR Foundation:

- 2.1. To provide Title "Academic Associate"& its certification to CUHP.
- 2.2. To provide access to knowledge resource centre of RFR Foundation.
- 2.3. To facilitate CUHP forindustry-academia, academia-academia collaborations at national & international level.
- 2.4. To provide support in conduction of Refresher Courses, Orientation courses, Research methodology programs and faculty development program.
- 2.5. Promotion of Research Activities in common interest area.
- 2.6. Privileged invitation for event(s) / program(s) organized by RFR Foundation and Bharatiya Shikshan Mandal (limited number of guests).
- 2.7. Display and information about facilities and opportunities at CUHPin the reception gallery at foundation.
- 2.8. Two nominations (incumbent authorities) in Samanvay Sabha for associates.
- 2.9. Support in execution, monitoring and evaluation process of various research activities.
- 2.10. Access and usage of knowledge resource centre, infrastructural facilities such as convention centre at special 'Academic Associates' discounted charges.
- 2.11. The facilities for students and faculties at concessional charges.

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- 2.12. Consultation, unbiased evolution of various educational processes as RFR FoundationAcademic &Administrative Audit program.
- 2.13. Information and invitation for research events conducted by other associate members for associates' network.

### ARTICLE 3: CO-ORDINATION AND NODAL OFFICER

Both entities shall mutually decide and designate a nodal officer. The nodal officer will have responsibility for fulfilling the objectives of this agreement and also will carry out all activities mutually agreed by the parties.

#### ARTICLE 4: SCOPE

The Parties acknowledge and agree that the Areas of Collaboration are not exhaustive in nature and the Parties shall in good faith, negotiate to elaborate upon the Areas of Collaboration, including additional areas of collaboration as may be mutually agreed and the rights, responsibilities and obligations of each Party in relation to each of the Areas of Collaboration. The Parties may, from time to time, execute addenda or modifications to this MOU to incorporate such additional scope of collaboration or discussions in accordance with Clause 6.3.

### ARTICLE 5: DURATION

This MOU shall be valid after its signature from the date of signing till for FIVEyears. The Parties may further extend the MOU with mutual written consent, in order to ensure continuous inputs regarding in light of changing trends and environment in the area of collaboration for this MOU. As part of subsequent extensions, the Parties may agree to make amendment in the MOU.

#### ARTICLE 6: TERMS

### 6.1 Finance

Both Parties shall be responsible to carry out the activities under the area of collaboration and New Project, Program, Conference, Seminar, Workshops and like which is co-designed/ organized by both of the parties. The financial arrangements wherever involved will be decided and approved after mutual consent and shall be

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agreed to for each activity individually on resource deployment, arrangements and mobilization will be planned vis-a-vis.

### 6.2 Assignment

Neither of the Parties shall assign any of their duties under this MOU to any other person or institution without prior approval of other party. A specific agreement will be entered into for each activity.

### 6.3 Amendments

No alterations, additions or modification hereto shall be valid and binding unless the same are reduced to writing and signed by both the Parties.

## 6.4 Non-Exclusive Discussions

The Parties acknowledge and agree that the Areas of Collaboration under this MOU are being undertaken on a non-exclusive basis and either Party shall be free to enter into or consummate transactions similar to the Areas of Collaboration with other parties in Bharat or elsewhere.

# 6.5 Confidentiality and Public Announcement:

- 6.5.1. "Confidential Information" means the confidential, proprietary, and trade secret information of the disclosing party to be disclosed by the disclosing party under this MOU, and comprises (a) information in tangible form that:

  (a) (1) bears a Confidentiality Legend, or (2) does not bear any Confidentiality Legend, if the receiving party knew, or reasonably should have known under the circumstances, that the information was confidential and had been communicated to it in confidence, and (b) discussions about that information that may occur before, at the same time, or after disclosure of the information. This MOU and all confidential information exchanged between the Parties pursuant to this MOU shall be held in confidence.
- 6.5.2.Neither Party nor any of the affiliates shall make any public announcement about the MOU and /or the scope of proposed engagement, without the prior written consent of the other Party. Any public announcement so made, shall be as outlined in the Article 2 of this MOU.

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# 6.6 License and Intellectual Property Rights

- 6.6.1.No license is granted under this MOU to either Party under any of the other Party's intellectual property rights, either expressly, by implication, inducement, estoppel or otherwise. Both Parties understand and acknowledge that grant of any such license shall always be express and in writing.
- 6.6.2.Both parties will take all necessary steps to protect the knowledge documents and intellectual Properties generated during the process or shared by the parties.

### 6.7. Conflict of Interest

Neither of the parties believes that the Collaboration contemplated by this MOU raise any actual or potential conflicts of interest. The parties agree that this MOU and the negotiation of the same (and any other agreements entered into in connection herewith) are independent of any past, present or potential future arrangements, and are not connected to an existing business relationship between either of the parties.

### ARTICLE 7: TERMINATION

**7.1** This MOU shall also terminate without liability to either party if otherwise agreed to by the Parties in writing with a notice period of 1 month.

### 7.2 Survival and binding Nature

- 7.2.1. Except for Clause 6 (Terms), Cause 7 (Termination) and 8 (Dispute Settlement) of this MOU, nothing contained in this MOU is intended to be or shall be construed in any way to be legally binding on any of the Parties.
- 7.2.2. Except as set forth elsewhere in this MOU, Clause 6 (Terms), Cause 7 (Termination), 8 (Dispute Settlement) shall survive the expiry or termination of this MOU.

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### ARTICLE 8: DISPUTE SETTLEMENT

### 8.1 Governing Law and Jurisdiction

- 8.1.1. This MOU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of Republic of Bharat. All disputes arising out of or related to this MOU, including without limitation all matters connected with its performance, will be governed by, and construed and interpreted under the laws of Bharat, without reference to conflict of laws principles.
- 8.1.2. All disputes and differences arising out of or in connection with this MOU shall be the first instance referred to arbitration by three (3) arbitrators, jointly appointed by Parties. The decision and award determined by such arbitration will be final and binding upon the Parties. The arbitration will be conducted in accordance with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, as may be in force from time to time. The arbitration proceedings will be conducted in Hindi, English or any Bharatiya Language and the seat of arbitration will be Nagpur

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter called the "MOU") is entered into by and between:

Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Dharamshala, the premier multidisciplinary educational institution in the Northern India engaged in interalia, teaching, training, research & development and skill development in diverse areas of humanities, social, physical and life sciences, through the Vice Chancellor having its office at Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Camp Office, Dharamshala (hereinafter referred to as "CUHP" which expression, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, shall include its successor(s), administrator(s) or permitted assigns), of the FIRST PART

#### AND

Himalayan Forest Research Institute (HFRI), Panthaghati, Shimla is one of the nine Regional Research Institutes of Indian Council of Forestry Research & Education (ICFRE), Dehradun, Uttarakhand, an Autonomous Body under the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Government of India. The Institute came into existence during 1998 on the upgradation of High Level Conifers Regeneration Research Centre, Shimla, established in 1977 primarily to develop technology for the regeneration of Fir and Spruce. The mandate of the Institute is to carry out forestry research in the areas of Biodiversity Assessment, Modeling, Conservation, Inspect-Pests and Disease Management, Planting Stock Improvement of Conifers and broadleaved associates, Agroforestry Practices in Lower, Mid and Higher Hills and Cold Desert region, Cultivation and Sustainable Harvesting of Medicinal Plants, Eco-restoration of Cold Deserts and mined out areas and Dissemination of Research Findings to various Stakeholders though Extension Activities, etc. The jurisdiction of HFRI for forestry research and extension activities covers the state of Himachal Pradesh and Union Territories of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh.

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"CUHP" and the "HFRI" are hereinafter individually referred to as the "Party" and collectively as "Parties"

### 1. PURPOSE AND SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT

- The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding between the two parties is to provide a framework for the proposed collaboration forpursuing quality research and building a new generation of highly skilled human resource; providing entirely new opportunities for employment and economic development, with main focus on environment, bio-resource, skill development, livelihood opportunities, science and technology, biotechnology, health and wellness lifestyle domain of the Indian Himalayan Region (IHR).
- The exchange of experience and scientific knowledge between the two institutions will be of great interest for their mutual progress and also for the service of the society.
- Thus understanding the strength of each party in the field of Science & Technology, Environment & Climate Change, Biotechnology & Skilled HR, the CUHP and HFRI have agreed to enthusiastically promote and facilitate the said goals and work jointly within the shortest possible time with least procedural and bureaucratic delays.

#### 2. PREAMBLE

Need for close linking of National Research Organizations/ laboratories with the Universities has been recognized by different scientific Ministries, Departments and other agencies, including the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC) and the University Grants Commission (UGC). In compliance to this felt need, the Himalayan Forest Research Institute (HFRI) and the Central University of Himachal Pradesh (CUHP), have decided to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) as per the following terms and conditions:

#### 2.1Start-up Activities

- 2.1.1 Both partiesagree upon to undertaketaking up the joint R&D initiatives at the earliest in the relevant fields.
- 2.1.2 Both parties agree toprepare and submit joint projectsofmutually agreed subjects to various funding agencies in State, Government of India including DST, DBT, ICMR, NMPB, etc. and other agencies, after signing the MoU.
- 2.1.3 HFRI and CUHPagreeto work in synergy with various departments of both the parties for R & D activities.

### 2.2 The Anticipated Long Term Activities:

2.2.1 Creating highly skilled Human Resource, ready to work manpower and, better quality of life for the society and Indian Himalayan Region (IHR)in particular.

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- 2.2.2 Attracting world-class talent & technology for the benefit of the IHR and the society.
- 2.2.3 Training local Human Resource, rural people, harnessing the Bio-resources of the State, and Interfacing with Local Academic and other Talent and Cultivating the Entrepreneurial Spirit in the Region.
- 2.2.4 Sharing respective important R&D facilities in order to promote academic and research activities to intensify the high priority area programmes of science and technology keeping in view the interest and philosophies of both the institutes and within the framed rules governing the two organizations.

#### 3. GENERAL

- 3.1 HFRIScientists and CUHPfaculty members of the Life Science, Environmental Science, Biotechnology, Biosciences, Institute of Integrated Himalayan Studies (IHS), Physical Science, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, Computer Science, Social Sciences, Economics, Geography, Sociology, IMS, IVS-Tourism, Geology, Agricultural Ergonomics Research Centre, Planning Research Corporation and Tribal Studies etc. will work towards joint research projects thereby mutually using research facilities developed/to be developed at HFRI and CUHP.
- 3.2 The faculty and students of the Life Science, Physical Science, Social Science and Humanities and other Departments of CUHPshall be allowed the use of library, computer and internet facilities of HFRI subject to the terms and conditions of HFRI. Scientists and Ph.D. Students of HFRI shall likewise be given the above mentioned facilities at CUHP subject to the terms and conditions of CUHP.
- 3.3 The faculty and students, as given in Para 4.1shall be issued identity cards upon individual requests, through concerned HoDs/Dean of Concerned Faculties of CUHP, to be shown to authorities of the Institute as perHFRIrules so as to provide access to laboratories and other facilities of the Institute depending uponavailability. Similarly, HFRI staff and research scholars will be provided access to CUHP facilities upon production of authentic identity cards/papers, issued by HFRI. However, prior intimation/approval needs to be taken from respective organizations/HoDs.
- 3.4 CUHP will recognize and accept the eligible HFRI Scientists for supervising research leading to the award of Ph.D. Degree as per the provisions of Ordinance for the Ph. D. programme of the University. HFRI, as a Research Centre, shall be duly recognized by CUHP, as per terms and conditions of CUHP.
- 3.5 Wherever required, HFRI shall provide hostel/guest house accommodation for CUHP faculty members and students coming to HFRI for research/collaboration work, subject to availability and on usual terms and conditions. Likewise, CUHP shall also make available hostel/guest house accommodation for HFRI scientists/research scholars/visiting faculty subject to availability and on usual terms and conditions.

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#### 4. ACADEMIC AND DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAMMES

- 4.1 For the mutual benefit of the two institutions, i.e. HFRI and CUHP, there can be exchange of HFRI Scientists and faculty members of the Life Science, Physical Science, Environmental Studies, Chemistry, Geography, Sociology, Biotechnology Departments and other related Departments of CUHP.
- 4.2 HFRI and CUHP Scientists/faculty members will help each other in preparing common observational/research programmes under intimation to the Head of the Institution.
- 4.3 While registering HFRI faculty/Research Scholars for Ph.D./D.Sc./D.Litt. degree in the CUHP subjects related to Life Science, Botany, Zoology, Environmental Science, Chemistry, Mathematics, Computer Science, Geography, Sociology, Microbiology, Biotechnology Departments, Physics, Tourism, Economics and other related subjects, the rules related to Ph.D./D.Sc./D.Litt. degree of CUHP will be valid. Faculty/Research scholars working at HFRI projects will be allowed for registration of Ph.D. degree of CUHP, under joint supervision of HFRI Faculty and one faculty from CUHP as per CUHPnorms.
- 4.4 Faculty/students from CUHP will be allowed to carry out a part of research work at HFRI and CUHP depending upon nature of the research topic and also the availability of laboratory space/facilities and under co-supervision of HFRI faculty. However, cost-intensive lab work experiments would be considered on case-to-case basis by the Director, HFRI and Vice Chancellor, CUHP.
- 4.5 Publications and patents (if any) emanating from joint research work carried out at HFRI & CUHP will be the property of both.
- 4.6 HFRI and CUHP will work closely to generate appropriately trained manpower in areas of individual/mutual competence through organization of symposia, short term training courses, etc.
- 4.7 HFRI will provide summer/winter training facilities/Dissertation to selected P.G. students of CUHP, depending upon availability of space and HFRI Scientists will help in the preparation of project reports of these students. Research outcome during the training will be the property of HFRI, and no publications can be made without the written consent of the Supervisor (HFRI Scientist).
- 4.8 The faculties of CUHP and HFRI will explore the possibility of jointly seeking funds for conducting collaborative research from India and foreign agencies with due approval of both the participating parties.
- 4.9 The joint sponsored and consultancy projects may be undertaken with both long-term and short-term goal(s), keeping in view the interest, strength(s) and philosophies of both the parties.
- 4.10 The ethical clearance for each project if required should be obtained from the respective Institute's Ethics Committees.

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#### 5. Miscellaneous:

- 5.1 Confidentiality and Non-Disclosure: The Parties agree that in view of confidential, proprietary information, data and documents will be shared under a non-disclosure /confidentiality agreement between the parties.
- 5.2 Amendments: This MOU shall not be varied or amended unless such variation or amendment is agreed in writing by the competent authorities of both the parties.
- 5.3 Notices: All the notices to the Parties in respect to the matters covered under this MOU shall be in writing delivered to the Parties at its notified addresses in Shimla or at Dharamshala and also through their registered E-Mail.

#### Shodh Sansthan Neri

The Shodh Sansthan Neri is a research institution located in the district of Hamirpur in the lush green hills of Himachal Pradesh, a state also called as Devbhoomi. The institute is devoted to the higher learning in history and culture with clear-cut emphasis on providing newer perspectives and ideas. The institute has been carrying out research in history on the themes of national and regional importance by providing alternative perspectives to established perceptions. 

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU) BETWEEN AYUSH HERBS PVT. LTD. NAGROTA BAGWAN, DISTT. KANGRA, AND

### CENTRAL UNIVERSITY OF HIMACHAL PRADESH, DHARAMSALA

This Memorandum of Understanding hereinafter referred to as MoU is signed on this 7th February, 2022 between the AYUSH HERBS PVT. LTD. NAGROTA BAGWAN, DISTT. KANGRA, hereinafter called "AYUSH HERBS PVT. LTD." which expression, unless otherwise provided, shall include its successors and assignees, on the one part and the Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Dharamshala, District Kangra (Himachal Pradesh)-176215, hereinafter called "CUHP" which expression, unless otherwise provided, shall include its successor of assignees on the other part.

### Preamble

Whereas the Ministry of Education (MoE) and the University Grants Commission (UGC) has realized the need for a close linkage between Industries and Universities in terms of research activities. In compliance to this idea, Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Dharamshala (H.P.) & AYUSH HERBS PVT. LIMITED, NAGROTA BAGWAN 25, INDUSTRIAL AREA, PHASE -1, NAGROTA BAGWAN, DISTT. KANGRA, INDIA, have expressed a desire to join hands for the cause of promotion of innovation and quality research and decided to sign Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to initiate academic and research program between the two Institutions.

Whereas both the Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Dharamshala (H.P.) & Ayush Herbs Pvt. Limited, Nagrota Bagwan 25, Industrial Area, Phase -1, Nagrota Bagwan, Distt. Kangra, India, recognize that they share common goals and are desirous to establish, a cooperative arrangement towards - strengthening innovative and research through mutual resource sharing.

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Whereas both organizations are desirous to associate in all other related areas as may be agreed upon for furtherance of knowledge based enterprises, apt technical and management skill for future technology development, exchanging of information and work towards effective Research Institutions-Academia partnerships for Ministry of Education (MoE).

THE FIRST PARTY representedherein by its **Dean**, **School of Earth and Environmental Sciences** (herein after referred as 'First Party', the institution which expression, unless excluded by or repugnant the subject or context shall include its successors-in-office, administrators and assigns).

#### AND

AYUSH HERBS PVT. LIMITED, NAGROTA BAGWAN 25, INDUSTRIAL AREA, PHASE -1, NAGROTA BAGWAN, DISTT. KANGRA, INDIA (hereinafter referred to as "AYUSH" which term wherever it occurs shall mean and include their legal heirs, successors, agents, representatives and assigns) herein after referred to as "Second Party".

(First Party and Second Party are hereinafter jointly referred to as 'Parties' and individually as 'Party') as

#### WHEREAS:

- A) First Party is: Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Dharamshala (H.P.) for innovation related activities in the University.
- **B)** First Party & Second Party believe that collaboration and co-operation between themselves will promote more effective use of each of their resources, and provide each of them with enhanced opportunities.
- C) The Parties intent to cooperate and focus their efforts on cooperation within area of Skill Based Training, Education and Research.
- D) Both Parties, being legal entities in themselves desire to sign this MOU for advancing their mutual interests.
- E) Ayush Herbs Pvt. Limited, Nagrota Bagwan 25, Industrial Area, Phase -1,

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**Nagrota Bagwan, Distt. Kangra, India,** the Second Party is engaged in Business, Manufacturing, Skill Development, Education and R&D Services in the fields of *-plant extracts, herbal concoction, Ayurveda-* and related fields

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS MOU, THE PARTIES HERE TO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

### **CLAUSE 1: CO-OPERATION**

- 1.1 Both Parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the **Institution** and its related wings. The Parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and shall share all information that may be relevant to secure additional opportunities for one another.
- 1.2 First Party and Second Party co-operation will facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities of the faculty of First Party providing significant inputs to them in developing new range of products/ process through suitable research/ training systems, keeping in mind the needs of the industry, the Second Party.
- 1.3 The general terms of co-operation shall be governed by this MOU. The Parties shall cooperate with each other and shall, as promptly as is reasonably practical, enter into all relevant agreements, deeds and documents (the 'Definitive Documents') as may be required to give effect to the actions contemplated in terms of this MOU. The term of Definitive Documents shall be mutually decided between the Parties. Along with the Definitive Documents, this MOU shall represent the entire understanding as to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede any prior understanding between the Parties on the subject matter hereof.

#### **CLAUSE 2: SCOPE OF THE MOU**

2.1 The budding Post graduates from the institutions could play a key role in technological up-gradation, innovation and competitiveness of an industry.

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Both parties believe that close co-operation between the two would be of major benefit to the student community to enhance their skills, knowledge & opportunities.

- 2.2 Curriculum Design: Second Party will give valuable inputs to the First Party in research / training methodology and suitably customize the curriculum so that the students fit into the industrial scenario meaning fully.
- 2.3 Industrial Training & Visits: Industry and Institution interaction will give an insight in to the latest developments / requirements of the industries; the Second Party to permit the Faculty, selected students of the First Party to visit its group companies and also involve in Industrial Training Programs for the First Party. The industrial training and exposure provided to students and faculty through this association will build confidence and prepare the students to have a smooth transition from academic to working career. The Second Party will provide its Labs / Workshops / Industrial Sites for the hands-on training of the learners enrolled with the First Party.
- 2.4 **Research and Development:** Both Parties have agreed to carry out the joint research activities in the fields of plant extracts, herbal concoctions and Ayurveda. The other faculty members may be involved as per the interest and mutual agreement of both the parties.
- 2.5 **Skill Development Programs:** Second Party to train the students of First Party on the emerging technologies in order to bridge the skill gap and make them industry ready.
- 2.6 Guest Lectures: Second Party to extend the necessary support to deliver guest lecture to the students of the First Party on the technology trends and in house requirements.
- 2.7 **Faculty Development Programs:** Second Party to train the Faculties of First Party for imparting training as per the industrial requirement considering the National Occupational Standards in concerned sector, if available.
- 2.8 Both Parties to obtain all internal approvals, consents, permissions, and licenses of whatsoever nature required for offering the Programs on the



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terms specified herein.

- 2.9 There is no financial commitment on the part of the Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Dharamshala (H.P.) the First Party to take up any program mentioned in the MoU. If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt separately.
- 2.10 The student shall be required to submit 'No Dues Certificate' from the Coguide on behalf of second party if any before submission of thesis.
  - 2.11 The student shall submit a copy of his/her thesis to the second party.

#### CLAUSE 3: INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

3.1 Nothing contained in this MOU shall, by express grant, implication, Estoppels or otherwise, create in either Party any right, title, interest, or license in or to the intellectual property (including but not limited to know-how, inventions, patents, copy rights and designs) of the other Party. However, when both the parties have performed some joint work, it should be guarded by the due credit of intellectual properties of the parties involved. The credits can be discussed mutually and consent of both parties should be there before guarding such rights.

### **CLAUSE 4: VALIDITY**

- 4.1 This MoU comes into effect from the date of its signing and will remain in force till the completion of five (05) years. Its validity can be extended by mutual agreement between both the parties.
- 4.2 This MoU supersedes all the previous correspondences and discussions, undertakings and agreement between the two parties on the subject pertaining to this MoU.

### **CLAUSE 5: FINANCIAL TERMS**

5.1 There shall be no financial obligations on the part of the Ayush Herbs Pvt.



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Limited, Nagrota Bagwan and Central University of Himachal Pradesh. Expenditures related to sample preparation, and experimentation would be borne by respective labs at their own end.

### **CLAUSE 6: FORCE MAJEURE**

6.1 Neither party shall be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligation / under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the force majeure events, such as, but not limited to Acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquakes, Strike(s), Lockout(s), Epidemics, Riots, Civil commotion etc. provided on occurrence and cessation of such events, the party affected by these shall give a notice in writing to the other party within one month of such occurrence and cessation. If the majeure conditions continue beyond six months, the parties shall then mutually decide about the future course of action.

### CLAUSE 7: RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES

7.1 It is expressly agreed that AYUSH HERBS PVT. LIMITED and CENTRAL UNIVERSITY OF HIMACHAL PRADESH, DHARAMSHALA (H.P.) are acting under this MOU as independent contractors, and the relationship established under this MOU shall not be construed as a partnership. Neither Party is authorized to use the other Party's name in any way, to make any representations or create any obligation or liability, expressed or implied, on behalf of the other Party, without the prior written consent of the other Party. Neither Party shall have, nor represent itself as having, any authority under the terms of this MOU to make agreements of any kind in the name of or binding upon the other Party, to pledge the other Party's credit, or to extend credit on behalf of the other Party.

Any divergence or difference derived from the interpretation or application of the MoU shall be resolved by arbitration between the parties as per the Arbitration Act, 1996. The place of the arbitration shall be at District Head Quarters of the

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First Party. This undertaking is to be construed in accordance with Indian Law with exclusive jurisdiction in the Courts of **Dharamshala**. The Memorandum of Understanding is not only limited to the condition laid in the draft but can be amended as and when need arises as per mutual consent of both the Parties.



यह समझौता ज्ञापन हिमाचल प्रदेश केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय, हिमाचल शिक्षा सिमति एवं योग भारती हिमाचल के मध्य दिनांक ०४ फरवरी २०२२ को हस्ताक्षरित किया जाता है।

#### 1. प्रस्तावना

योग अध्ययन केंद्र (हिमाचल प्रदेश केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय), हिमाचल शिक्षा समिति एवं योग भारती हिमाचल, योग के विषय पर अध्ययन-शिक्षण, एवम् गहन शोध के कार्य में जुटी है। उपरोक्त संस्थाएं, योग के प्रचार-प्रसार की दिशा में भी कार्यरत है। योग अध्ययन केंद्र (हिमाचल प्रदेश केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय), हिमाचल शिक्षा समिति एवं योग भारती हिमाचल गत दो वर्षों से परस्पर सहयोग भी कर रहे हैं, जिसमें हिमाचल शिक्षा समिति एवं योग भारती से योग विषय के विशेषज्ञ, योग अध्ययन केंद्र (हिमाचल प्रदेश केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय) में व्याख्यान एवं योगाभ्यास कराने के लिए समय-समय पर आते रहे हैं। अतः योग अध्ययन केंद्र, (हिमाचल प्रदेश केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय), हिमाचल शिक्षा समिति एवं योग भारती हिमाचल के संसाधनों को पाठ्यक्रम विकास, योगाभ्यास से संबन्धित शिविरों/वर्गों एवं व्याख्यान/कार्यशालाओं/संगोष्टियों के आयोजन, अनुसंधान व अन्वेषण के कार्य हेतु दृढता से एक पटल पर लाने का उचित समय आ गया है। इससे हिमाचल प्रदेश केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय के योग अध्ययन केंद्र में शिक्षा ग्रहण कर रहे विद्यार्थियों को योग की सिद्धता एवं उत्कृष्ट योग शिक्षक के निर्माण हेतु सहायता मिलेगी। यह समझौता विद्यार्थियों में योग के विषय में अनुसंधान की भावना को बढ़ाने में उपयोगी सिद्ध होगा। योग अध्ययन केंद्र, (हिमाचल प्रदेश केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय), हिमाचल शिक्षा समिति एवं योग भारती हिमाचल के बीच ढृढ अनुसंधान संबंध व बेहतर तालमेल स्थापित हो सके, उसकी पूर्ति और उद्देश्यों को ध्यान में रखते हुए 'एक औपचारिक समझौता' हस्ताक्षरित किया जाना एक महत्वपूर्ण कदम है।

### 2. समझौता ज्ञापन की अवधि एवं समय वृद्धि

समझौता ज्ञापन की वैधता सीमा पंद्रह (१५) वर्ष रहेगी, जिसे आपसी सहमति तथा नई नियमों एवं शर्तों के साथ आगे कई वर्षों तक बढ़ाया जा सकता है।

### 3. योग अध्ययन केंद्र, (हिमाचल प्रदेश केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय) की गतिविधियां

हिमाचल प्रदेश केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय की स्थापना केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय अधिनियम, २००९ के अंतर्गत हुई। इस विश्वविद्यालय में योग अध्ययन केंद्र की स्थापना २०१९ को हुई। योग अध्ययन केंद्र द्वारा योग अध्ययन में

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स्नातकोत्तर डिप्लोमा एवं योग अध्ययन में सर्टिफिकेट नामक दो कार्यक्रम वर्तमान में चलाये जा रहें हैं। हिमाचल प्रदेश एवं देश के अन्य राज्यों से विद्यार्थी इन कार्यक्रमों में शिक्षण अर्जित कर रहें हैं। इसके अतिरिक्त योग अध्ययन केंद्र, हिमाचल प्रदेश में योग के प्रचार-प्रसार के लिए सतत प्रयास कर रहा है। हिमाचल प्रदेश केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय ने सन् २०१५ में प्रथम अंतर्राष्ट्रीय योग दिवस का आयोजन किया। तद्पश्चात प्रत्येक वर्ष २१ जून को अंतर्राष्ट्रीय योग दिवस का आयोजन किया जा रहा है। इस कार्यक्रम के माध्यम से विद्यार्थियों, शिक्षकों एवं समाज में योग के प्रति जागरूकता बढ़ाने का प्रयास किया गया है। सन् २०२१ में इस कार्यक्रम के उपलक्ष्य पर योग अध्ययन केंद्र ने विशेष रूप से विद्यार्थियों, शिक्षकों एवं समाज के सभी वर्गों के लिए ५१ दिवसीय योग शिविर का आयोजन किया। इसके अतिरिक्त यह केंद्र, योग एवं संबन्धित विषयों पर नियमित व्याख्यानों का आयोजन करता रहता है। यह केंद्र समाज के भिन्न-भिन्न आयु वर्गों के लिए आवश्यकता अनुसार समय-समय पर योग शिविरों का आयोजन भी करता रहता है।

### 4. हिमाचल शिक्षा समिति की गतिविधियां

हिमाचल प्रदेश में हिमाचल शिक्षा समिति का कार्य १९८० में पांवटा साहिब में एक सरस्वती विद्या मन्दिर प्रारम्भ होने के साथ शुरू हुआ। उसके उपरान्त हिमाचल शिक्षा समिति से कार्यकर्ता जुड़ते गए। अनेक बाधायें आने के बाद भी विद्यालय बढ़ते गए। हिमाचल प्रदेश में ये विद्यालय ग्रामीण जनजातीय एवं दुर्गम क्षेत्रों में चल रहे हैं। हिमाचल के सुदूर क्षेत्र चम्बा जिले का पांगी हो या लाहौल-स्पिति का केलांग तथा उदयपुर, जो वर्ष के छ: महीने देश के अन्य भागों से कटा रहता है, में भी कार्य चल रहा है। हिमाचल शिक्षा समिति सम्पूर्ण प्रदेश में अनुशासित तथा संस्कार रूपी ज्ञान का प्रकाश निरन्तर देने में अग्रसर है। हिमाचल शिक्षा समिति, हिमाचल प्रदेश में नर्सरी कक्षा से लेकर १०+२ तक के २०८ सरस्वती विद्या मंदिरों का संचालन कर रही है। हिमाचल जैसे पहाड़ी प्रदेश में सरस्वती विद्या मंदिरों ने भारतीय जीवन मूल्यों के आधार पर शिक्षा व्यवस्था लागू कर अपनी एक पृथक पहचान बनाई हैं।

भारतीय ज्ञान परंपरा में योग एक महत्वपूर्ण विषय है। आज स्वस्थ एवं चुस्त-दुरुस्त रहने की दृष्टि से समाज में योग शिक्षा की विशेष रूप से मांग बढ़ रही है। इसी निमित हिमाचल शिक्षा समिति ने अन्य विषयों के साथ योग विषय का पाठ्यक्रम अपने विद्यालयों में लागू किया है। हिमाचल शिक्षा समिति के पास अनेकों योग प्रशिक्षित प्रशिक्षकों की टोली भी हैं।

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### 5. योग भारती हिमाचल की गतिविधियां

'पहला सुख निरोगी काया' की परिकल्पना को साकार रूप देने के उद्देश्य से योग भारती हिमाचल की स्थापना ०८ अक्टूबर २०१९ को सोलन, हिमाचल प्रदेश में हुई। संस्था का मुख्य प्रशिक्षण केंद्र — 'माधव सृष्टि परिसर', अश्वनी खड, गण की सेर, सोलन में है।

योग भारती हिमाचल का मुख्य उद्देश्य है, समाज में योग के क्षेत्र में कार्य कर रहे विभिन्न संस्थानों से तालमेल बिठाकर योगाभ्यास, योग शिविर, योग प्रशिक्षण वर्ग एवं योग कार्यक्रमों की योजना तैयार करना ताकि सभी प्रांतों के हर जिले और तहसील से लेकर पंचायत स्तर एवं गांव तक योग शिक्षक तैयार हो सके। इस उद्देश्य को प्राप्त करने हेतु योग भारती हिमाचल, हिमाचल प्रदेश के अलग-अलग स्थानों पर दो-तीन दिनों के योग शिविर का आयोजन कर रही है। इन शिविरों में योग के मूलभूत सिद्धांत, योग दर्शन, आसन, प्राणायाम रहस्य, मानव शरीर रचना, मुद्रा ज्ञान, सूर्य नमस्कार, पारंपरिक दंड बैठक, सूक्ष्म व्यायाम, पंचतत्व, पंचकोष, सप्तधातु एवं एक्यूप्रेशर का प्रशिक्षण दिया जाता है।

इसके अतिरिक्त, योग भारती हिमाचल, हर सप्ताह सामूहिक योगाभ्यास, प्रत्येक महीने योग चिकित्सा कैंप का आयोजन, विविध योग संस्थानों के सहयोग से सभी जिलों में योग वर्ग व योग के कार्यक्रम का आयोजन एवं स्कूल, कॉलेज, मंदिर, गुरुद्वारा, सत्संग भवन, सामाजिक एवं धार्मिक संस्थानों में योग अभ्यास केंद्र स्थापित करने के लिए प्रयासरत है।

संस्था के सोलन स्थित मुख्य प्रशिक्षण केंद्र में अनेक योग प्रशिक्षण शिविरों का आयोजन किया जा चुका है। कोरोना काल के दौरान विशेष ऑनलाइन शिविर लगाये गए, जिसमें लगभग ८०० से ज्यादा लोगों ने योग प्रशिक्षण प्राप्त किया। प्रत्येक रविवार योग शिक्षकों के लिए अलग-अलग योगाचार्यों एवं विविध प्राकृतिक चिकित्सा पद्धतियों के विशेषज्ञों द्वारा ऑनलाइन योगाभ्यास करवाया जा रहा है।

योग भारती हिमाचल के प्रमुख आयाम है - योग शिक्षक, आरोग्य मित्र प्रशिक्षण, वन औषधि पौधारोपण, अपना ग्राम स्वस्थ ग्राम, गर्भ संस्कार, युवाओं एवं युवितयों में योग के प्रति रुचि पैदा करना, प्राथमिक

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उपचार, विद्यालय स्वास्थ्य प्रबोधन, जड़ी बूटियों द्वारा घरेलू उपचार, मधुमेह मुक्त भारत अभियान, महिला सशक्तिकरण, नित्य प्रति योगाभ्यास से सामाजिक बुराइयों का अंत करना।

### 6. समझौता ज्ञापन के मुख्य बिन्दु

- हिमाचल प्रदेश केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय के विद्यार्थी, शिक्षक एवं गैर-शैक्षणिक कर्मचारी योग भारती
   हिमाचल द्वारा संचालित शिविरों में अपनी स्वेच्छा से भाग ले सकते हैं।
- तीनों संस्थाएं योग से संबन्धित विषयों पर संयुक्त रूप से व्याख्यान, संगोष्ठी, शिविर एवं लघु
   प्रशिक्षण कार्यक्रमों का आयोजन करेंगे।
- तीनों संस्थाएं संयुक्त अनुसंधान परियोजनाओं पर कार्य करेंगे।
- योग अध्ययन केंद्र, (हिमाचल प्रदेश केंद्रीय विश्वविद्यालय) के संकाय सदस्य एवं विद्यार्थी अपने अनुसंधान कार्यक्रमों एवं साहित्य सर्वेक्षण हेतु हिमाचल शिक्षा सिमिति तथा योग भारती हिमाचल में अपने सुविधा अनुसार आवागमन कर सकेंगे।
- जहां तक संभव हो सके, तीनों संस्थाएं एक दूसरे के शिक्षकों, योग प्रशिक्षकों, अधिकारियों एवं विद्यार्थियों को उनकी शोध कार्यक्रमों हेतु आधिकारिक यात्रा के समय अपने-अपने छात्रावासों / अतिथि गृहों में नियमानुसार एवं उपलब्धता के अनुसार आवासीय सुविधाएँ उपलब्ध करवाएंगे।

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter called the "MOU") is entered into by and between:

Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Dharamshala, the premier multidisciplinary educational institution in the Northern India engaged in inter-alia, teaching, training, research & development and skill development in diverse areas of humanities, social, physical and life sciences, through the Vice Chancellor having its office at Central University of Himachal Pradesh, Camp Office, Dharamshala (hereinafter referred to as "CUHP" which expression, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, shall include its successor(s), administrator(s) or permitted assigns), of the FIRST PART

#### AND

**Bundelkhand University, Jhansi**, the seat of higher learning came into existence on August 26, 1975, vide Government of Uttar Pradesh Notification No. 10/15-60/74 under the provision of the U.P. Universities Act. However, though belonging to the younger generation of the Indian Universities, the Bundelkhand University has fast transformed into a University of excellence offering opportunities to the aspiring youths to pursue higher education.

Recognized as Number One University of the Uttar Pradesh and accredited thrice by NAAC, Bundelkhand University is shining as a polar star on the horizon of self-sustenance and real Independence. With its strong infrastructure, financial and human resource base it has immense potential to establish itself as one of the leading higher education institution of regional, national and global repute.

Its more than hundred courses at UG, PG and Doctorate Level encompass all the major fields of studies e.g. Basic and Life Sciences, Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Physiotherapy, Agriculture, Management, Law, Computer Applications, Law, Education, Arts and Fine Art, Tourism and Hotel Management, Earth Sciences, Environmental Studies, Forensic Science and Criminology, Library & Information Science, Languages and other Social Studies. BU will be the Second Party.

"CUHP" and the "BU" are hereinafter individually referred to as the "Party" and collectively as "Parties"

### 1. PURPOSE AND SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT

 The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding between the two parties is to provide a framework for the proposed collaboration for pursuing quality research and building a new generation of highly skilled human resource; providing entirely new

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opportunities for employment and economic development, with main focus on environment, bio-resource, skill development, livelihood opportunities, science and technology, biotechnology, hospitality and tourism management, health and wellness lifestyle domain of the Indian Subcontinent.

- The exchange of experience and scientific knowledge between the two institutions will be of great interest for their mutual progress and also for the service of the society.
- Thus understanding the strength of each party in the field of Science & Technology, Environment & Climate Change, Biotechnology & Skilled HR, Hospitality and Tourism Management the CUHP and BU have agreed to enthusiastically promote and facilitate the said goals and work jointly within the shortest possible time with least procedural and bureaucratic delays.

#### 2. PREAMBLE

Need for close linking of National Research Organizations/ laboratories with the Universities has been recognized by different scientific Ministries, Departments and other agencies, including the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC) and the University Grants Commission (UGC). In compliance to this felt need, the Bundelkhand University (BU) and the Central University of Himachal Pradesh (CUHP), have decided to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) as per the following terms and conditions:

### 2.1Start-up Activities

- 2.1.1 Both parties agree upon to undertake the joint R&D initiatives at the earliest in the relevant fields.
- 2.1.2 Both parties agree to prepare and submit joint project of mutually agreed subjects to various funding agencies in State, Government of India including DST, DBT, ICMR, NMPB, AICTE, UGC etc. and other agencies, after signing the MoU.
- 2.1.3 BU and CUHP agree to work in synergy with various departments of both the parties for R & D activities.

### 2.2 The Anticipated Long Term Activities:

- 2.2.1 Creating highly skilled Human Resource, ready to work manpower and, better quality of life for the society and Indian Subcontinent in particular.
- 2.2.2 Attracting world-class talent & technology for the benefit of the society.
- 2.2.3 Training local Human Resource, rural people, harnessing the Bio-resources of the State, and Interfacing with Local Academic and other Talent and Cultivating the Entrepreneurial Spirit in the Region.
- 2.2.4 Sharing respective important R&D facilities in order to promote academic and research activities to intensify the high priority area programmes of science and technology keeping in view the interest and philosophies of both the institutes and within the framed rules governing the two organizations.

#### 3. GENERAL

3.1 BU and CUHP faculty members of the Life Science, Environmental Science, Biotechnology, Biosciences, Institute of Integrated Himalayan Studies (IHS), Page - 3 - of 6

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Physical Science, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, Computer Science, Social Sciences, Economics, Geography, Sociology, IMS, IVS-Tourism, Geology, Agricultural Ergonomics Research Centre, Planning Research Corporation and Tribal Studies etc. will work towards joint research projects thereby mutually using research facilities developed/to be developed at BU and CUHP.

- 3.2 The faculty and students of the Life Science, Physical Science, Social Science and Humanities and other Departments of CUHP shall be allowed the use of library, computer and internet facilities of BU subject to the terms and conditions of BU. Scholars, Ph.D. Students and Faculty members of BU shall likewise be given the above mentioned facilities at CUHP subject to the terms and conditions of CUHP.
- 3.3 The faculty and students, as given in Para 4.1shall be issued identity cards upon individual requests, through concerned HoDs/Dean of Concerned Faculties of CUHP, to be shown to authorities of the Institute as per BU rules so as to provide access to laboratories and other facilities of the University depending upon availability. Similarly, BU staff and research scholars will be provided access to CUHP facilities upon production of authentic identity cards/papers, issued by BU. However, prior intimation/approval needs to be taken from respective organizations/HoDs.
- 3.4 CUHP will recognize and accept the eligible BU Faculty Members for supervising research leading to the award of Ph.D. Degree as per the provisions of Ordinance for the Ph. D. program of the University. BU, as a Research Centre, shall be duly recognized by CUHP, as per terms and conditions of CUHP.
- 3.5 Wherever required, BU shall provide hostel/guest house accommodation for CUHP faculty members and students coming to BU for research/collaboration work, subject to availability and on usual terms and conditions. Likewise, CUHP shall also make available hostel/guest house accommodation for BU Faculty members/research scholars/visiting faculty subject to availability and on usual terms and conditions.

### 4. ACADEMIC AND DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAMMES

- 4.1 For the mutual benefit of the two institutions, i.e. BU and CUHP, there can be exchange of BU faculty members of the Life Science, Physical Science, Earth Science, Environmental Studies, Chemistry, Geography, Sociology, Biotechnology, Hospitality and Tourism Departments and other related Departments of CUHP.
- 4.2 BU and CUHP faculty members will help each other in preparing common observational/research programmes under intimation to the Head of the Institution.
- 4.3 Faculty/students from CUHP will be allowed to carry out a part of research work at BU and CUHP depending upon nature of the research topic and also the availability of laboratory space/facilities and under co-supervision of BU faculty. However, cost-intensive lab work experiments would be considered on case-to-case basis by the Vice Chancellor, BU and Vice Chancellor, CUHP.
- 4.4 Publications and patents (if any) emanating from joint research work carried out at BU & CUHP will be the property of both.

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- 4.5 BU and CUHP will work closely to generate appropriately trained manpower in areas of individual/mutual competence through organization of symposia, short term training courses, etc.
- 4.6 The faculties of CUHP and BU will explore the possibility of jointly seeking funds for conducting collaborative research from India and foreign agencies with due approval of both the participating parties.
- 4.7 The joint sponsored and consultancy projects may be undertaken with both longterm and short-term goal(s), keeping in view the interest, strength(s) and philosophies of both the parties.
- 4.8 The ethical clearance for each project if required should be obtained from the respective Institute's Ethics Committees.

#### 5. Miscellaneous:

- 5.1 Confidentiality and Non-Disclosure: The Parties agree that in view of confidential, proprietary information, data and documents will be shared under a non-disclosure /confidentiality agreement between the parties.
- 5.2 Amendments: This MOU shall not be varied or amended unless such variation or amendment is agreed in writing by the competent authorities of both the parties.
- 5.3 Notices: All the notices to the Parties in respect to the matters covered under this MOU shall be in writing delivered to the Parties at its notified addresses in Jhansi or at Dharamshala and also through their registered E-Mail.

- 6.1 The Parties represent and warrant to each other that the individual signing on their respective behalf has been duly authorized and empowered to execute and deliver this Agreement and the Agreement, when fully signed and delivered, is binding on both the parties i.e. the "CUHP" and "BU". This MOU is valid till the time both the parties mutually consent to work together in synergy with each other.
- 6.2 It is agreed that the progress of this MOU will be monitored by the Vice-Chancellor, CUHP and the Vice Chancellor BU through periodic meetings. Any change/modification/termination as introduced/suggested by the Review Committee (comprising of the Vice Chancellor, CUHP and the Vice Chancellor -
