



ABOUT THE SEMINAR

‘Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav’ is an initiative to celebrate and commemorate 75 years of progressive independent India and the glorious history of its people, culture and achievements. This Mahotsav is dedicated to the people of India who have been instrumental in bringing India thus far in its evolutionary journey and they also have the power and potential to activate India 2.0, fuelled by the spirit of Atmanirbhar Bharat. ‘Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav’ is an embodiment of all that is progressive about India’s socio-cultural, political and economic identity. One of the primary focuses of the celebration is to document our unsung heroes, lesser-known personalities and places that have made invaluable contributions to India’s freedom struggle. It commenced on 12th March 2021 with a 75 weeks countdown to our 75th anniversary of independence and will be concluded post a year, on 15th August 2023. India’s freedom was a result of decades of struggle by freedom fighters and activists. The British were able to rule over us because the feeling of nationalism was missing from the minds of Indians. India is a diverse society with many languages, religions, etc. India gained its independence on 15th August 1947, after being under British Raj. Several freedom fighters fought to free the country from British rule. In the regional context, the case of the Himalayan state of Himachal Pradesh is inquisitive to delve into.

The main objectives of the seminar are

- To reminisce about the country’s freedom and mark the occasion of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav in reverence for the Unsung Heroes of HP.
- To study the Unsung Heroes and Heroines of Freedom Struggle during the Independence of Himachal Pradesh.
- To explore the socio-economic status of women strugglers, to study lesser-known incidents of freedom strugglers in Himachal Pradesh.

- To find out the impact on the Socio-economic life of Freedom Heroes in Himachal Pradesh.

MAJOR SUB-THEMES OF THE SEMINAR

The theme of the seminar is further broadly categorized into the following sub-themes:

- Indian freedom struggle, Swaraj, Sarvodya and Swadeshi
- Freedom struggle and experiences of women of India.
- Indian Women and Independence, their struggle and experiences for Independence
- Reflections on freedom struggle through arts in the Himalayas
- Patriots and patriotism: Freedom Heroes of Himachal Pradesh during the British era
- Impact on the Socio-economic and Political life of Freedom Heroes in India
- Unheard Narratives of the Unsung: Lore, Tales and Legends of India
- Lesser-known incidents of freedom strugglers in India: A Sociological perceptive
- Primary work, Social Work and Contributions of lesser-known institutions/organisations in the freedom struggle of India

(The above list of sub-themes is indicative. Papers from other relevant fields related to *Unsung Heroes of India* may also be accepted.)

CALL FOR PAPERS

Academicians, scholars and students are invited to submit abstracts of their papers for consideration. Each presenter will be given 10 minutes for presentation. The abstract should strictly not exceed 400 words and the research papers should be ideally around 4000 words typed in Hindi (KrutiDev 10) and English 12-point font in Times New Roman. All the abstracts should reach us on or before **8th November 2023**. The last date for submitting complete research papers is **12th November 2023**. The paper should contain the topic/title, name of the author, mailing address, and telephone No. and email address.
