ACTIVITY NO.1 "Online Session on COTPA 2003 and its amendments"

A virtual session on COTPA 2003 and its amendments was organised by Nada India Foundation in collaboration with Department of Social Work on Friday 12th November 2021 from 4:00PM-5:00PM as a part of series of activities on COTPA. The speakers at this time were Dr.Bhagyashree Kaushal and Dr. Huda Aziz. The state coordinator of Himachal Pradesh (Nada India Foundation)Mr.Mangal Singh was the chief coordinator of program. Mangal Singh welcomed both speakers on the behalf of Nada India Foundation. Firstly, Dr.Huda Aziz presented a insightful presentation on COTPA 2003 and its provisions. While addressing the students Dr.Huda shared the reasons to bring an act on Prohibition of Advertisement and Regulation of trade and commerce , production, supply and distribution of Tobacco products. She discussed various provisions of COTPA 2003 like section 6 of act deals with prohibition on sale of tobacco products to person below 18 years of age and in places within 100 yards radius from the outer boundary of educatinal institutions .
